He is a recruiter for the Noblesville U.S. Army recruiting station and was found with other Army recruiters attending the final Noblesville Millers home varsity football game on Friday night at Beaver Materials Field. He recruits for the active Army and the Army Reserve. "We decided to sponsor the football game tonight. So we wanted to come out and show our support for Noblesville, both the high school and the football team and for the community itself." The Army recruiters' presence at the game is to "remind the community that we're here and we're here to help and do more than just recruit." The Noblesville Army recruiting station and Army Career Center is at 17033 Mercantile Blvd., next to Papa John's Pizza. Sgt. Rigel was born and raised in Bismarck, Mo., and "graduated high school there with 18 people." He then joined the Army, with boot camp in Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., and then went to Hunter Army Airfield in Georgia, then Fort Campbell, Ky., with a Special Forces group, then to Fort Richardson in Anchorage, Alaska, and taught at the officer academy for two years, then to Fort Carson in Colorado Springs, Colo. "I very specifically wanted to go and see things," said the chemical biological radiological and nuclear specialist for the Army. He celebrated 16 years in the Army on Oct. 15. He and his family -- wife, Brittney, and kids, Adalade, 7, and Ameliah, 5 -- have lived in Noblesville for two-and-one-half years. He retires in about years.

If you're a regular reader of this column, you know what comes next. This is when I recognize all our Notable Nineties by printing the entire list.

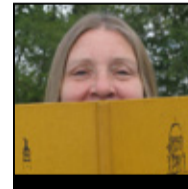
If you're not a regular reader, an explanation is in order.

After Jerry passed away, I kept the list going.

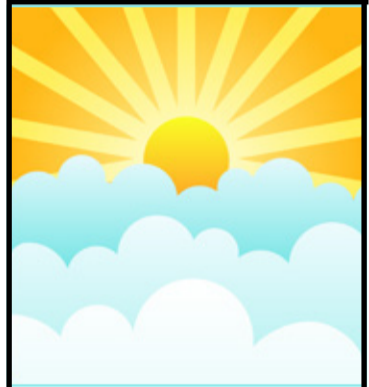

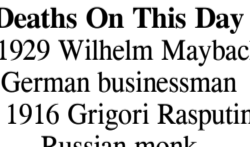

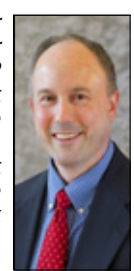

Rebecca Ann Mauk De Long

March 31, 1931 - Dec. 22, 2021

Rebecca Ann Mauk De Long, 90, Carmel, went to be with her Lord and Savior on Dec. 22, 2021.

She was born March 31, 1931 in Grand Rapids, Mich. she was the fifth child of Beatrice (Dick) Mauk and Ralph A. Mauk Sr.

While attending Grand Rapids Junior College, she met and married Robert J. De Long, with whom she had three daughters. The family moved to Carmel, Ind. in 1964. Rebecca returned to college, earning her BA in Psychology from Indiana University (IUPUI) at age 40. Twenty-five years later she graduated with her Juris Doctor (JD) degree from IU School of Law (Indianapolis), with an emphasis on constitutional law.

During her undergraduate years, Mrs. De Long volunteered at a psychiatric hospital, tutored first grade students in math and reading, assisted in the annual Caulk of the Town event and weatherizing homes for low-income families. In the mid-1970s, Mrs. De Long served as Activity/Social Services Director for a long-term health care facility. She became one of the first people in the state to be certified in Reality Orientation, a program designed to improve cognitive and psychomotor function in people who are confused or disoriented.

In 1979, Mrs. De Long went to work for Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Indiana, where she served on a team conducting Medicaid compliance audits of nursing homes throughout the state. In 1988 she was promoted to Healthwatch Liaison for all aspects of a federally mandated well-child program.

Mrs. De Long was proud of her parental, educational and professional achievements. But her greatest joy was her relationship with God through His son, Jesus Christ. Participating in this event will help others in need and build Magalski's network in the Tri-State area.

Marion County resident Manon Voice's long-term creative business goal is to find new and innovative ways to use art as a means of conversation and awareness around social issues and as a tool for community building, engagement, and



empowerment. She will utilize the fellowship funding to create poetry and hip-hop to fuel more social awareness around housing stability issues in Indiana. Each produced piece will explore a different topic, such as eviction, gentrification, and redlining. After completing the album, Manon will pair performance with panel discussion on these topics, inviting people from impacted communities and those working on the issues to participate in discussions that can lead to actionable steps toward solutions. Read the project descriptions of each of the 102 entrepreneurs.

About the Program: On-Ramp is a three-day accelerator course for Indiana-based creative entrepreneurs to foster their business skills, followed by a funded fellowship to put the learning into action.

According to new research performed by the Indiana Arts Commission and course leader Elaine Grogan-Luttrull of Minerva Financial Arts, individuals from the inaugural cohort developed business knowledge and sustained skills following their participation in the program.
