The largest segment of the funding the city recieved will go towards phase 1 of the Reimagine Pleasent Street project, which aims to reduce congestion on SR 32 and immprove east-west connectivity in Noblesville.

Would you look at that, Hamilton County? Another week has passed us by; if 2021 seemed to fly by, then 2022 is approaching supersonic speeds at this point. And while the snow may have stopped (only temporarily - another cold week seems to be coming), the news certainly has not. All around the county, exciting things are happening and we at The Times hope we can keep you up to date. Here are some of the biggest stories in Hamilton County from the

last week.

The City of Noblesville has received a total of \$12,219,034 from the Indianapolis Metropolitan Planning Organization (IMPO). This includes a new award of \$10,359,670 for three major infrastructure projects within the city and increased financial support in the amount of \$1,859,364 for two previously awarded projects. The IMPO governing board approved the grants during its meeting this

morning.

"We are grateful to have IMPO's and the Noblesville Common Council's partnership and support with these projects. All of the new projects and the previously awarded trail projects will provide better and safer mobility in our city," Noblesville Mayor Chris Jensen said.

Noblesville had three of the 30 Central Indiana projects that were awarded a total of \$78

sidetracked by his parents. Cyrus Colter spent less than ten years here — all of them as a child — and information about his life in Hamilton County is scanty.



Whether serving as high school class president, collecting donations to build the fieldhouse, playing a role in bringing the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame to town, or serving as mayor, he was devoted to his community. He was always willing to help a person in need.

Some of Mr. Ayer's accomplishments include being a member of the National Honor Society, an All-Conference and All-State football player, as well as an innovator in business. He achieved many milestones. He received the Sagamore of the Wabash Award from Governor Bayh and The Community Service Award: State of Indiana by Governor Orr.

Mr. Ayer's was a firm believer in God and often loved to tell about his Sunday School teacher at the First Friends Church, who taught him to recite scripture every day, which he did. His favorite scripture passage is Psalm 23. He attended both Foursquare Gospel Church of New Castle and First Apostolic Church of New Castle.

Valerie Obear Named MIAA Field Athlete of the Week



The Trine University women's track and field team had two student-athletes named Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) Athlete of the Week heading into the conference championship event.

Senior Valerie Obear (Fishers, Ind. / Hamilton Southeastern) has been tabbed MIAA Field Athlete of the Week and classmate Evie Miller [Fort Wayne, Ind. / Homestead] has been tabbed MIAA Track Athlete of the week.

Obear also broke the previous best mark in school history in the weight throw at Notre Dame to collect her fourth Athlete of the Week award of the season. Her best throw marked 19.00 meters (62' 4.00"), and is the best score in NCAA DIII. Kara Eck held the previous record from a

throw in the event at 18.45 meters (60' 6.25"), set in the 2017-18 season.

Miller, who has won the award on two other occasions in the 2021-22 indoor season, broke her own school record in the mile run with a time of 4:45.13 at the University of Notre Dame's Alex Wilson Invitational. Miller posted the sixth-fastest time in NCAA DIII while breaking her own school record in the event.

The pair will be top contenders at the MIAA **Indoor Championships** on Saturday, February 26 at home in the Keith E. Busse/Steel Dynamics Athletic and Recreation Center (ARC). Obear is looking for her third consecutive title in the weight throw while Miller has tallied eight wins in her illustrious career at the event.

for the passport and receive prizes for visiting multiple parks and properties across the state. Visitors need to check in from their smartphone at one of the designated passport locations.



Notice is hereby given in accordance with Indiana Code ("1.C.") 20-23-8-14(a) that the Board of Trustees of Hamilton Heights School Corporation approved on February 16, 2022, Resolution Initiating an Amended and Restated Plan of Organization Changing Governing Body Composition and Manner of Election ("Resolution"), which initiated an amended and restated plan of organization changing the composition of the governing body of the Hamilton Heights School Corporation composition and manner of its election ("Plan"). The Resolution, which includes therein the initiated Plan change, is as follows:

(here follows text of Resolution)

A RESOLUTION INITIATING AN AMENDED AND

RESTATED PLAN OF ORGANIZATION CHANGING GOVERNING BODY COMPOSITION AND MANNER OF

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees of Hamilton Heights School Corporation ("Board") currently consists of a member, non-partisan elected Board with:

(i) two (2) members elected (a) as residents from within one of two geographically defined areas within the school corporation and (b) by voters residing within the same one of two geographically defined areas within the school corporation; (ii) two (2) members elected (a) as residents from within the second of two geographically defined areas within the school corporation and (b) by voters residing within the same second of two geographically defined areas within the school

(iii) one (1) member elected (a) as an at-large member who may reside anywhere within the boundaries of the school corporation and (b) by voters residing anywhere within the school corporation; and WHEREAS, the Board has concluded that it should initiate a proposed plan to change the composition and method of

electing the Board; and
WHEREAS, Indiana Code ("I.C.") 20-23-8, et. seq., provides the Board with the authority and process by which it may

initiate a proposed plan to change the composition and method of electing a governing body of a public school corporation; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Board that pursuant to I.C. 20-23-8-10(a)(2), it adopts the following changes in the Hamilton Heights School Corporation Organization Plan by which members of the Board are to be elected

following the Effective Date (as defined below). (End of Recitals – Here Follows Plan Change)

Plan for Governing Body Composition Change A. Board of School Trustees

 Number & Residential Districts – The governance of Hamilton Heights School Corporation shall be vested in a non-partisan Board composed of five (5) members elected at a November general election in accordance with I.C. 20-23-4-29.1. There shall be two (5) geographically defined and limited residence districts from which two (2) members residing therein each, two from each district, shall be elected to the Board (thereby comprising a total of four (4) resident members) and an "at large" district comprised of the entire area of the Hamilton Heights School Corporation, from which one (1) member shall be elected. All five (5) members shall be elected by all voters residing within the school corporation. The Board intends that this nanner of election be that option in I.C. 20-23-4-27(c)(2). The two residence districts, each from which two (2) members of the Board shall reside, shall be as follow:

a. White River Township Residence District – That portion of the Hamilton Heights School Corporation bounded by the boundaries of White River Township, Hamilton County, Indiana.

b. Jackson Township Residence District – That portion of the Hamilton Heights School Corporation bounded by the boundaries of Jackson Township, Hamilton County, Indiana.

 Term of Office – Membership on the Board shall constitute a "lucrative office" as the term is used in Article 2, § 9 of
the Constitution of the State of Indiana. Members shall be elected to a term of office of four (4) years commencing on January 1 of the year following the year of their election.

3. Organization and Appointment of Officers – The Board shall annually organize within fifteen (15) days after the

commencement date of the members' terms of office, or within such time as might otherwise be required by law. The Board shall elect from among its membership a president, vice president, and secretary each of whom shall be a different member of the Board. The Board may make such other appointments as permitted by, and in accordance with, applicable law.

4. Compensation – Members shall be entitled to compensation for the performance of their duties on the Board, as

limited by applicable law, and as determined, from time to time, by resolution of this Board.

5. Eligibility for Membership on Board – To be eligible to serve on the Board, a candidate for election to the Board must have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years before the candidate's term of office would begin. Candidates running for election to the Board from one of the two geographically limited and defined residence districts must have been a continuous resident of that residence district for at least the one (1) year immediately prior to the general election on which the candidate's name appears on the ballot for election to the Board. Candidates running for election to the Board as an "at-large" member must have been a continuous resident of the school corporation for at least one (1) year immediately prior to the general election on which the candidate's name appears on the ballot for election to the Board. Property ownership shall not

be an eligibility requirement for a candidate seeking election to the Board.

6. Vacancies on Board – Vacancies on the Board existing because of the death of a school board member shall be filled in the manner provided by I.C. 20-26-4-4.5, as from time to time amended. Vacancies on the Board existing for any reason

of an elected, qualified, and acting school board member shall be filled in the manner provided by I.C. 20-26-4-4(c), as

from time to time amended. B. Transition Plan Pending Board Elections

1. Schedule of Current Board Terms – The terms of office of the current members of the Board, their current corresponding election district, the date their current term began, and the date their current term ends, all as determined by the law and the Hamilton Heights School Corporation governing body selection plan then in effect at the time of their election,

2. Transition from Election District to Residence District Representation: The representation of the existing election districts shall be transitioned to residence district under this proposed plan change in the following manner

a. Member Ozolins currently (1) resides in, (2) represents, and (3) is elected solely by voters residing in White River Township. His residence will be within the geographically defined and limited White River Township Residence District under this proposed plan as set forth in section A(1)(a) above. From the Effective Date of this proposed plan until the end of his present term, Member Ozolins shall be one of the two Board members from the White River Township Residence District under this proposed plan.

b. Member Pennington currently (1) resides in. (2) represents, and (3) is elected solely by voters residing in White Rive Township. Her residence will be within the geographically defined and limited White River Township Residence District under this proposed plan as set forth in section A(1)(a) above. From the Effective Date of this proposed plan until the end of her present term, Member Pennington shall be one of the two Board members from the White River Township Residence District under this proposed plan.

c. Member Davis currently (1) resides in, (2) represents, and (3) is elected solely by voters residing in Jackson Township. Her residence will be within the geographically defined and limited Jackson Township Residence District under this proposed plan as set forth in section A(1)(b) above. From the Effective Date of this proposed plan until the end of her present term, Member Davis shall be one of the two Board members from the Jackson Township Residence District under this

d. Member Cayanaugh currently (1) resides in. (2) represents, and (3) is elected solely by voters residing in Jackson Township. His residence will be within the geographically defined and limited Jackson Township Residence District under this proposed plan as set forth in section A(1)(b) above. From the Effective Date of this proposed plan until the end of his present term, Member Cavanaugh shall be one of the two Board members from the Jackson Residence District under this proposed plan.

e. Member Cooper is currently the one member elected as an at-large member who may reside anywhere within the geographic boundaries of the school corporation and is voted by all voters living within the school corporation. From the Effective Date of this

proposed pian until the end of his present term, Member Cooper shall be the one member elected by the at-large district consisting of the entire boundaries of the school corporation.

3. Election Date for Board Members under Proposed Plan Change – Upon passage of this proposed plan change and its becoming effective upon the Effective Date, all members of the Board will be elected at general elections held in November of the appropriate years under the following schedule:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the superintendent, school corporation legal counsel, and the officers of this Board shall take all other actions and execute all other documents as are reasonably convenient or otherwise necessary to affect the change in the plan for the selection of this governing body as hereinabove set forth. (End of Resolution)





"We are just running some errands, and he likes to come downtown Noblesville and walk around the Courthouse and go see the (historic) courtroom. We just love being out together," she told me. She was heading out to teach music lessons after their visit.

Jennifer Nicholson -- a retired Noblesville High School music teacher who directed the NHS Singers and who later taught music at Noble Crossing Elementary and also taught private music lessons (voice and piano and beginner guitar), was a professional vocalist, inspirational speaker and coach of Girls on the Run -- loved her family, loved singing and acting, and loved teaching music to children. She was a treasure in our community and loved by many.

And my heart is breaking today with the recent news of the loss of this wonderful individual in our community. By now, many of our readers have already heard the sad news of Jennifer Nicholson's passing on Saturday night (Feb. 19). She was 63.

Her husband, Dave, posted on Facebook Sunday morning: "Dear friends, Jennifer was always better at posting on Facebook. It is with a breaking heart that I let you know she died last night. She is celebrating with Jesus, for that we give great thanks! Love each other deeply, give each

other hugs, celebrate with music, love Jesus totally. As Jen would say, 'Music moves the soul like nothing else can."

She had just undergone a successful surgery for a torn meniscus, a common knee injury, on Thursday morning (Feb. 17). On Saturday night, she threw a blood clot that went to her heart causing a heart attack.

Noblesville's Moffett Craig said it best: "Jennifer Nicholson brought light, love, joy, compassion, strength, and laughter to so many," including her high-school-age grandson, Johnathan Baker, who studied music with Nicholson. I even attended one of his recitals at the First Presbyterian Church. Hundreds of people have reacted and commented on Dave Nicholson's Facebook post and created their own Facebook posts, sharing Jennifer Nicholson memories.

She loved life. "I'm 60 and proud of it," she told me during our conversation in December 2018, after celebrating the milestone just three months earlier. She said for Christmas that year, she and Dave received a beautiful photo of all of their grandkids. "That's our favorite gift, besides our kids and grandkids." She loved her grandchildren and was especially proud that granddaughter Claire has grandma's red hair.

She was all about living life to the fullest. Every photo that I've seen of Jennifer, she is smiling, sharing fun times with her family, husband, children, grandchildren and friends. There are photos of Jennifer and Dave sledding at Forest Park with grandkids, skydiving on their wedding anniversary and Jennifer arriving to see her lifelong idol Carol Burnett at the Chicago Theatre. There was also a photo of Nicholson singing the National Anthem, "My Old Kentucky Home'

in June. So many beautiful photos, so many wonderful memories that we all have

of Jennifer Nicholson. She was born Sept. 18, 1958, graduated from **Bloomington South High** School in 1976 and from Indiana University in 1980, just a year after marrying husband, Dave Nicholson, on May 26, 1979. They met at IU. The couple and their two children, Joshua and Hannah, originally came to Noblesville to plant a new Free Methodist Church and led the Noblesville Open Door congregation. Then Dave was asked to start Noblesville Police Department's chaplain program, which is still going today and for which he has

been honored. For Christmas, Jennifer Nicholson performed as a Dickens Caroler in hired professional quartets for holiday parties. But how I remember her most was her acting and singing in plays and musicals at The Belfry Theatre in Noblesville.

In 2018, she was nominated for Encore Association's Best Female Singer and Best Lead Actress in a Musical for "Nunsense II: The Second Coming" during The Belfry's 2017-18 season. Dave Nicholson helped with the set construction on the show.

In "Nunsense II," Jennifer Nicholson portrayed the Rev. Mother Mary Regina. It was just 22 years prior. in 1993, she played Sister Mary Hubert in the same musical at The Belfry. She also played Sister Hubert in 2015 and 1992, in the original "Nunsense." Her favorite song in "Nunsense?" "I like 'Holier Than Thou,' because I get to be crazy and wild," she told me in 2015 during the run of "Nunsense." Noblesville's Carla Crandall acted alongside Jennifer Nicholson in "Nunsense" and "Nunsense II," directed by Noblesville's Elaine Wagner, then Crandall directed both "Nunsense" and "Nunsense II" in 2015 and 2018, respectively. In 2018, Jennifer Nicholson acted alongside Johnathan Baker, Anna Neal, Maddux Morrison, Abigail Pittman, Addie Cooley, Katelyn King, Kylee Booher, Cathie Morgan, Diane

Dave and Jennifer Nicholson were always together.

Reed, Kalea Spurlock, twins Meredith Milburn and Morgan Milburn, Nancy Rairdon, Jennifer Poynter, Rosie Allenson, Michael Lipphardt and a slew of other actors who are likely thankful they had the opportunity to perform alongside the talented Jennifer Nicholson.

Crandall said while their paths only crossed at The Belfry, she "couldn't fathom the world without Jennifer Nicholson and her bright and shining light."

In 2016, Jennifer Nicholson was nominated for Encore Association's Best Major Supporting Actress in a Play, for "Cheaper by the Dozen." She played the role of the mom, Mrs. Gilbreth, also directed by Crandall, at The Belfry.

Then in 2021, when Crandall directed "Cheaper by the Dozen" again, she called on Jennifer Nicholson after the actress who played Mrs. Gilbreth became ill on the day of a

performance. Crandall learned at 2 p.m. that she wouldn't have the cast member for the 8 p.m. performance on the Thursday of the show's second weekend and called Jennifer Nicholson at 3 p.m. to see if she would walk on for the 8 p.m. performance as well as the entire weekend's remaining performances. So Jennifer and Dave (who was to be honored that night at another event) talked it over, she found her old script

and agreed to meet at 5 p.m. to learn the blocking and rehearse the show. On that night, by showtime, Jennifer Nicholson had the play almost memorized for Act I, and looked at her script only occasionally for Act II. By Friday night, the actress didn't even carry her script, Crandall said.

'What a blessing God gave to me," she said. ... What a blessing that Jennifer could come in and do that part ... It was the greatest gift I could have received from Jennifer. It was just wonderful. The audience got to see Jennifer on stage one last time in a totally unexpected opportunity.'

When explained how Jennifer Nicholson had joined the cast in the curtain speech to the audience, she received a standing ovation.

Crandall said, "Her whole life deserves a standing ovation."

about shining a light on lost or little known aspects of this country's African

American past. Cyrus Colter's mother, Ethel, was born in New Albany, Indiana. She was in her early teens, or close to it, when she moved here with her father, Reverend Miles Bassett, and mother, Mary (Lucy Washington's granddaughter,) sometime in the 1890s.

Socially minded, Ethel Colter held offices in the First Baptist Church's Sunday School, the local B.Y.P.U., (Baptist Young People's Union,) and Eureka Chapter No. 36 of the Order of the Eastern Star. She was also a Grand Lodge officer of the O.

In addition, she belonged to several social clubs.

Sadly, her life was cut short by consumption (tuberculosis) in 1916. She was only 31 when she died.

At that time, Indianapolis' African American newspaper, The Indianapolis Recorder, described her as "a highly respected and much loved woman, being active in the religious, club, fraternal, and social life of her hometown.'

Cyrus Colter's father, James, was even more of a force in the community.

Originally from the Rockport, Indiana, area, James Colter came here in 1907 as a barber, but he did a lot more than cut hair and trim beards.

Like his wife, he held offices in the First Baptist Church Sunday School and the local B.Y.P.U. chapter.

He belonged to Noblesville's African American Knights of Pythias lodge, and in 1914 he became the editor of the Indiana Pythian News.

For several years, he was the state representative for the Recorder, traveling around Indiana selling subscriptions and advertising. He also did some writing for the newspaper.

A staunch Republican, he participated in local politics as a speaker and organizer, and in 1908, he was a delegate to the Noblesville Township Republican Convention.

In 1917 he combined his political interests with his writing skills to compose a short play, "Mr. Voter," which he staged as a benefit for the Calanthe Court, the women's auxiliary of the Knights of Pythias. His humorous treatment of the suffragette question packed the house with a racially mixed audience.

The production included some vocal and instrumental numbers, calling attention to Colter's musical side. (He managed several musical groups over the years and even sang in

some ensembles himself.) In 1918 he served as one of the marshals for the parade that celebrated the end of World War I.

These are just a few of the things he did while living here. I could easily have filled this column with his activities alone.

Sometime between 1918 and 1920, Cyrus Colter and his younger sister moved to Henry County with their grandparents, Reverend and Mrs. Bassett.

About that same time, James Colter also left Noblesville. He spent most of the rest of his life in Muncie and died there in 1946.

Residential has committed to donate the land required for the roundabout and an additional 25 acres of non-floodplain land to increase the size of adjacent parkland, totaling 123 acres for the White River passive nature park.

If you've driven by Noblesville's Federal Hill Commons this week, then you likely noticed that the parking lot and market plaza are starting to be demolished in preparation for the \$50 million planned Village at Federal Hill apartment/ parking garage project.

It's a public-private project between the City and Old Town Companies with 220 living

units and 31,700 square feet of commercial retail space. The project was announced at Noblesville Mayor Chris Jensen's 2020 State of the City address.

The project's first phase will be a five-story, mixed-use building connected to the garage at the east end of the property, according to Athletics. That building will feature 77 residential units and could include up to 1,000,000 square feet for non-residential uses. Three other buildings are planned as part of the project: Two four-story buildings and a three-story building with two levels of office space over ground-floor retail are in the plans.
