What makes Duane Kingery smile? "Going to the Father's Day Car Show," said the 64-year-old Noblesville resident, who was found showing his red 1953 Chevy pickup at the Central Indiana Vintage Vehicles 31st annual Father's Day Car Show on Sunday in Forest Park in Noblesville. He also has a 2007 Chevrolet Corvette in Monterey Red. He was born and raised in Noblesville and is a 1976 graduate of Hamilton Southeastern High School. He has a wife, Nancy, and two daughters, Kelsey and Amber, both who graduated from Noblesville High School and Nancy worked for Noblesville Schools. He has a new granddaughter, 3-monthold Brianna Rose Krueger. He bought his truck 12 years ago. "I liked the color," said Kingery, whose truck won "Best Paint" at the show. Other reasons he was drawn to buy the truck: "I liked the shape, I liked the design ... the contours, the way the fenders look. It's just a beautiful design in my opinion .... It was already painted red. I put different wheels on it, put a different battery box on the back, changed the stereo out, put disc brakes on it, so a lot of mechanic changes," he said. The truck has a V8 engine, a 350 crate engine, 700R automatic transmission, so it's a four-speed automatic transmission with overdrive, and has power steering and power brakes, he said. Kingery called his truck a "resto-mod," (a classic that's been restored, but modified with modern parts and technology). "I have a hobby of old cars, plus I like to camp, so we have a motorhome. We go to Texas a lot, because that's where Brianna Rose is." See a photo of Kingery and his winning red truck in today's edition of The Times.

Time for another reader column!

Remember Dartown Road, one of the "Roads to Nowhere" I wrote about in April?

Mary Reynolds, who works at the Sheridan Historical Society, emailed that Jim Pickett, the former president of the society, said the road between 246th and 256th Streets that appears as "Dartown Road" on local maps was actually called "Dan Robbins' Road," after the prosperous African American farmer

who lived there. Apparently, the people responsible for officially naming the road got confused and "Dan Robbins" somehow got twisted into "Dartown."

According to Robbins' obituary in the March 8, 1937 Noblesville Daily Ledger, he



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

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) is developing plans for a proposed multi-use trail construction and bridge rehabilitation project in the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana. The project will take place on Little Chicago Rd. from Elderberry Rd. to Carrigan Rd.

The purpose of this project is to improve north-south connectivity of non-motorized transportation facilities and connectivity to neighborhoods along Little Chicago Rd. from Elderberry Rd. to Carrigan Rd. Additionally, the purpose of the project is to improve Hamilton County Bridge No. 106 (29-00106, NBI #29000094) to condition ratings greater than 7 (good) of 9 for all

The need for the project stems from the lack of north-south connectivity for non-motorized transportation facilities (pedestrian and bicycle) along Little Chicago Rd. from Elderberry Rd. to Carrigan Rd. Presently, there are several residential neighborhoods (South Harbor, Pine Knoll, and The Bluffs), apartment /condominium complexes (Lions Creek and The Villas on Morse Reservoir), and businesses within the Harbour Town Shoppes strip that lack connectivity for non-motorized transportation facilities along Little Chicago Rd. Another need for the project stems from the deteriorated condition of Hamilton County Bridge No. 106. According to the most recent bridge inspection report, the existing bridge has a condition rating of 5 (fair) of 9 for all bridge elements and the channel bank protection has a condition of 6 of 9(bank slump, widespread minor damage).

This project involves construction of a 10 ft. wide, multi-use, asphalt icent to Little Chicago Rd. along the east side of the roadway for its entire length, providing the connection between the current terminus of the trail at each location and linking the north and south side of Morse Reservoir. The project will involve constructing curb and gutter and storm sewer along the east side of the roadway. The northbound travel lane will be widened to 12 ft. and the roadway will be resurfaced alongside the limits of the trail work. The existing causeway and bridge will be widened over the reservoir.

The bridge rehabilitation will include widening of the piers and end bents and replacement of the beams, bridge deck, and railing. An 11 ft, wide raised sidewalk will be constructed over the bridge. The bridge rehabilitation will include widening the travel lanes to 12 ft. and shoulders to 4 ft. Deterioration and cracking of the piers and end bents will be repaired. The widened portion of the substructure will sit on a pile foundation and riprap scour countermeasures will be placed.

The project will also include replacement of the bridge approach slabs, standard guardrail components, curb ramps and geometrics for ADA compatibility, retaining wall construction, public road approach and driveway reconstruction, utility relocation, and waterway mitigation

The proposed construction of this project will require 1.17 acres of new permanent right-of-way and 0.02 acres of temporary right-of-way. The project will result in 0.51 acres of impacts to the Morse Reservoir, which is a jurisdictional Waters of the United States

The project is expected to take 11 months to complete. The maintenance of traffic (MOT) plan proposes a road and bridge closure of approximately four months and for one lane of the road to remain open with temporary signal or flaggers for approximately seven months. During the full road closure, an official detour route utilizing SR 38, Hague Rd., and Carrigan Rd. will be used during construction. Other local roads may be used by local traffic. Access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction. School corporations and emergency services will be notified of closures prior to construction. The proposed start of construction is 2024.

The cost associated with this project is approximately \$7 million which includes preliminary engineering, right-of-way, and construction with both federal, state, and local funds anticipated to be used. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and INDOT have agreed this project falls within the guidelines of a Categorical Exclusion (CE) Level 3 environmental document. AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE CITY

OF NOBLESVILLE, HAMILTON COUNTY, INDIANA Stony Bluffs

Super-Voluntary Annexation
WHEREAS, the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana received a etition requesting that certain territory generally located along the north side of East 166th Street and approximately 700-feet east of Union Chapel Road with a common address of 11002 East 166th Street, as herein after described (Annexation Territory"), be annexed by Noblesville; and

WHEREAS, the petition has been signed by the sole owner (i.e. 100%) of the property within the Annexation Territory; and WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code §36-4-3-5.1 (e), on or around

May 24, 2022, the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing regarding the

WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code §36-4-3-1.5, the Common Council has determined that the Annexation Territory is contiguous at least by one-eight (1/8) of the aggregate external boundaries of the Annexation Territory and coincides with the boundaries of the City.

WHEREAS, the written fiscal plan and definite policy adopted by resolution provides for the provision of services of a non-capital nature (including police protection, fire protection, street and road maintenance and other non-capital services ormally provided within the corporate boundaries of the City) to the Annexation Territory within one (1) year after the effective date of this annexation in a manner equivalent in standard and scope to those non-capital services provided to areas within the current corporate boundaries, regardless of similar topography, patterns of land use

WHEREAS, the written fiscal plan and definite policy adopted by resolution provides for the provision of services of a capital nature (including but not limited to street construction, sewer facilities, and storm water drainage facilities) to the Annexation Territory within three (3) years after the effective date of this annexation in a manner equivalent in standard and scope to those capital services provided to areas within the current corporate boundaries, regardless of similar topography, patterns of land use, and population density; and in a manner consistent with federal, state and , procedures, and planning criteria; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council now desires to annex the Annexation

Territory generally known as "Stony Bluffs".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana as follows:

Section 1. Contiguity. The petition requesting voluntary annexation for the Annexation Territory, further described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein and graphically depicted in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Annexation Territory. The real estate containing approximately 7.63 acres, more or less legally described in Exhibit A, and graphically depicted in Exhibit B, both attached thereto and incorporated herein and generally known as the Stony Bluffs, is hereby annexed to and declared to be a part of the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County,

Council District. The above described real estate is hereby assigned to Section 3. City Council District 6 and shall become a part thereof immediately upon the effective date of this ordinance.

All prior Ordinances or parts thereof that may be inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby superseded. The paragraphs, sentences, words, and Annexation Territory of this Ordinance are separable, and if a court of competent jurisdiction thereof declares any portion of this Ordinance or the Annexation Territory unconstitutional invalid, or unenforceable for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the remaining portions of the Annexation Territory or this

The effective date of this annexation shall be as soon as allowed by law following its adoption, execution, and publication as required by law. EXHIBIT A

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

of this cast before, Barb Weaver of Noblesville and Cathie Morgan of Carmel. Weaver and Morgan appeared together in "Done to Death," a Belfry play that Lafferty directed in 2017, along with an independent project they did together in 2020, when they performed "The Women of Lockerby" at an outdoor venue during the pandemic.

The other six actors are all new to Lafferty, although she had seen three of them -- Chris Taylor, Jen Poynter and Sara Eberhardt -- on stage prior to auditions.

"So, it's true what they say: You never know who is in the audience when you are performing," Lafferty said.

Directors often attend plays just to "scout out" the talent, said Lafferty, who had not seen the remaining actors, Jeff Haber, Sarah Powell and Bryan Gallet, until the first night of auditions.

Husband and wife, Mason Odle and Andrea Odle of Noblesville, have created a beautiful set, designed

by Ian Marshall-Fisher of Indianapolis. The Odles constructed the set on The Belfry stage, then dismantled it, transported the set to Ivy Tech and reassembled it, with the help of cast and several other great friends of theater, she said.

Some of the costumes for the show, Lafferty said, designed by Cathie Morgan, were borrowed from Grace Church in Noblesville. Some of the costumes were borrowed from The Players club of nonprofessional actors known for doing skits and short plays. Some costumes were made by Morgan.

Eric Dixon of Indianapolis and Sloan Haywood of Fishers are handling sound with wireless mic management by Geoff Lynch of Noblesville. Eric Matters of New Palestine designed the lighting, being operated by Andrew Young of Fishers. Props are provided by Susie Walden of Noblesville.

funny."

was born into slavery in North Carolina. He came to Indiana with his parents shortly after the Civil War and the family settled in Westfield.

After his marriage in 1881, Robbins moved to the farm northwest of Bakers Corner on what is now Dartown Road.

That explains the Adams Township Dartown Road, but Westfield's Dartown Road is still a bit of a mystery. I looked at a couple of old maps and saw nothing that indicated the two roads were ever physically connected.

My cousin, Nancy Lacy, wondered if the hymns that were played for the 1869 Commemoration Day (Decoration/ Memorial Day) service in Crownland Cemetery went by other names

That appears to be the case, although the Hamilton County Register's account of the ceremony doesn't actually assign a name to either hymn; it simply provides the name of the tune and lyrics for each.

The Crownland service opened with a variation of "Pleyel's Hymn," a Masonic funeral dirge composed by Ignaz Joseph Pleyel in 1791. The lyrics, which were in common use for such occasions at that time,

begin, "Love unchanging for the dead, Lying here

in gloried sleep . . . Most modern versions of the song seem to be known simply as "Pleyel's Hymn," but I did find one called "Children of the Heavenly King." There may be others.

The closing hymn was sung to the tune of "Old Hundred" — "Blest are the martyred dead who lie in holy graves for Freedom won . . .

"Old Hundred" is attributed to 16th century composer Louis Bourgeois. The best known version of that hymn today may be "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow," often called the Doxology.

between the rows of trees. I got curious about other camp locations so I checked the old newspapers and found that prior to 1960, the Manuka Neighborhood (Noblesville, Fishers and Arcadia) day camp was held in Forest Park. That ended because the park was

getting too crowded. According to my cousin, the Dancing Librarian, the Sheridan Scouts' day camp was held at yet another site — north of State Road 32, just east of State Road 421. (I actually remember that camp. I taught crafts there one summer while I was in college.)


