Next up, Basile Westfield Playhouse presents "30 Reasons Not to be in a Play," opening Thursday and continuing through Aug. 7. Smith is producer for the annual summer youth production directed by Tanya Haas. The Marion, Ind., native and Ball State University graduate caught the theater bug a few years ago after retiring from the FBI. He started out acting, before moving into producing. He has played a drunken choir director in "Our Town" at The Belfry and, before that, a drunken custodian in "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" at The Belfry and a drunken dime-store owner in "Picnic" at Westfield Playhouse. He played a drunken handyman in "Hide and Seek" at Carmel Community Players, a drunken priest in the Fringe Short Play Festival, and a drunken newspaperman in "More Light" at the Nickel Plate Arts. His first lead acting role was as Grandpa Jack in Buck Creek Players' "The Unexpected Gift." He also played Judge Taylor in Booth Tarkington Civic Theatre's "To Kill A Mockingbird." He loves acting with kids and attending their shows. "That's what makes me smile. I religiously follow the careers of the kids that I work with to see what happens to them," said Smith, a mentor for Westfield Playhouse Youth Advisory Council. He has produced several Westfield shows, including "The Monologue Show" youth production in summer 2020 and the sold-out Playhouse holiday 2021 musical, "White Christmas." If James H. Williams told you that directing kids shows

came easy, he would be telling a white lie. The Fishers resident, who came on as assistant director for The Belfry Theatre Apprentice Players youth under the late Connie Murello-Todd, tries to be prepared for nearly anything. But he said, this year, "Boy, has it been a challenge." In years past, The Belfry Theatre Apprentice Players musical productions alternated, ages 5-13 during the odd years and ages 13-18 during the even years. There hasn't been an Apprentice Players show since 2019. Due to the pandemic, Belfry youth productions in 2020

and 2021 were canceled. So this summer, The Belfry show director and The Belfry Theatre board of directors decided to open the auditions up to both age ranges. Disney's "Frozen Jr." will be on stage this Thursday through Sunday, with five performances at The Ivy Tech Auditorium in Noblesville. Tickets are still available. Williams said, "With this year's production being ages 5-18, I've really had to juggle a lot by figuring out how to integrate the ages. Most of the older kids have younger siblings, so

September 30, 1932 - July 15, 2022

Kermit Carter, age 89, of Sheridan, Indiana, passed away on Friday afternoon, July 15, 2022, at Riverwalk Village in Noblesville, Indiana.

He was born on September 30, 1932, in Laurel County, Kentucky, son of the late Estill and Virginia (Hughes) Carter.

Honorably serving his country as a soldier in the United States Army during the Korean War, Mr. Carter faithfully sent his paychecks back home to help his family with their expenses. He was very proud of his military service and always enjoyed swapping stories with fellow veterans he met throughout the years. After his service was complete, Mr. Carter hired on with Firestone as a production line worker and retired after 31 years with the company.

He was a member of the Noblesville American Legion Post 45 and attended Six Points Church in Sheridan.

He loved the outdoors and always found a good reason to be outside. Mr. Carter enjoyed hunting and fishing, and never missed a chance to go down to Virginia, where he walked the mountains and spent time with family. His favorite place, however, was his wooded property at home. Surrounded by nature, he learned to both love and respect the wildlife that also call his property home. He loved to walk the woods, watching the birds and all the critters going about their days, and spending enough time around them that he ended up with a couple opossums and racoons that acted more like pets.

Mr. Carter's family was a very important part of his life. He always looked forward to going to the sale barn with his brother Logan, and never missed an opportunity to get in a good joke or two, usually at his family's expense. He loved his grandchildren dearly, and that includes his grand, black lab furbaby, Tippy.

He was a very humble man of strong faith who never turned a blind eye toward anyone who needed help.

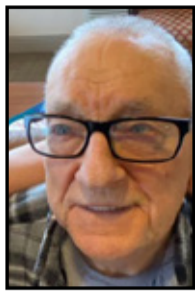

Free Back-To-School Immunization Clinics for HSE Students Offered by Fishers Health Department this Week

The Fishers Health Department will host several Back-to-School Immunization Clinics at various Hamilton Southeastern Schools and events beginning today. HSE District students can receive free doses of required immunizations for school, including Tdap, Meningococcal (MCV4 and Men B), HPV, as well as COVID-19 vaccines.

Fishers Health Department Back-to-School Immunization clinics are open to Hamilton Southeastern Schools students only and take place:

- **Tuesday, July 26 from 7 a.m.-noon at Hamilton Southeastern High School (12499 Olio Road)**

- **Wednesday, July 27 from 8 a.m.-noon at Hamilton Southeastern High School (12499 Olio Road)**

- **Wednesday, July 27 from 2-7 p.m. at Hamilton Southeastern Intermediate Junior High (12278 Cyntheanne Road)**

- **Monday, Aug. 1 from 2-6 p.m. at Fishers High School (13000 Promise Road)**

Advanced registration is required for students at <https://patients.vaxcare.com/registration>, use code IN72472 to select appointment time and location. Free immunizations are available for children with or without insurance.

Students on a regular vaccine schedule typically require immunizations prior to entering kindergarten, sixth and twelfth grades. All students are recommended to be up to date on COVID-19 vaccine recommendations and receive an annual flu vaccine. Please refer to

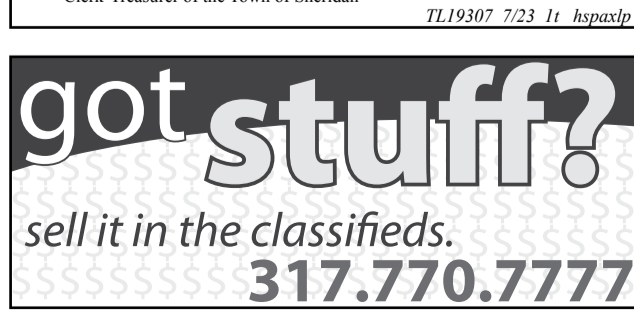



big brother or sister kicks in pretty quick to help them."

But for those who don't have older siblings, he said, the younger kids are still learning to follow instructions and learning patience, "all while reminding myself that I need a little of that myself and not get frustrated as quickly because a 5- or 6-year-old doesn't understand what you want them to do as easily as the teenager does," Williams said.

Despite it not being easy, he said, "For a few different reasons but mainly, I enjoy mentoring youth by teaching them that it's OK to use their imagination and break out of their comfort zone by trying something new."

He said, "One of the best parts has been watching several of the youth grow up and come back year after year. A few, this year, are aging out and want to make this year be the last with Mr. Jim, and some still have a few years to go before they do."

Part of the fun of directing youth is seeing kids come out of their shells.

"I've always loved watching the kids start out shy and bashful and become the total opposite by the end of the summer," Williams said. "I'd also say, being around the kids all the time keeps me young and definitely on my toes."

Being that some of the kids are close to aging out this year, Williams said he

wanted to pick a show that he knew "would have a big name draw."

So Disney's "Frozen Jr." was chosen. "Frozen" is the 16th highest-grossing film worldwide (released in 2013), and the highest-grossing animated film of all time, and the best-selling musical in the United States (now only surpassed by its own sequel and the 2019 live-action remake of Aladdin).

"Frozen" came out nine years ago and still has a huge fan base, even for kids who weren't born at the time," he said.

The modern Disney classic is based on the 2018 Broadway musical, and brings Elsa, Anna, and the magical land of Arendelle to life, onstage. The show features memorable songs from the animated film, including "Let it Go," plus five new songs written for the Broadway production.

Due to the popularity of the show, Williams said, "We have many new faces stepping on the stage for the very first time." Many of them want to return in summer 2022 for The Belfry Theatre Apprentice Players' musical, "Willy Wonka Jr.," which will also be open to ages 5-18.

"I can tell you right now, it never gets old seeing the kids hit their moment on stage where they realize who their character is, or they realize where they belong," he said. "We don't just try to teach lines, dance, and song. I also question these kids about their character, locations, emotion, and intentions. Well, their hard work and character development over the past several weeks has paid off ... Thank you for your guidance in teaching youth theater, Ms. Connie Murello-Todd. I wouldn't

Another special thanks goes out to Noblesville's George Kristo, a sponsor of The Belfry Theatre's 2021-22 season and who graciously donated funds so that a cyclorama backdrop could be rented and used with light projections to create illusions onstage. Plus, all of the season and show sponsors and donors that patrons will see in their programs, including Adriene's Flowers & Gifts, which has donated flowers to sell at the door this weekend.

In fact, unless you drive U. S. 31 frequently, Wilson's isn't on anybody's beaten path. Halfway between Kokomo and Indianapolis at the intersection of U. S. 31 and 256th Street, it's basically in the middle of nowhere. They have an Arcadia address, but a Sheridan phone number.

And yet, they've had a successful business for over 50 years.

It all started in 1968 when Bill Wilson, Sr. began selling eggs out of an old refrigerator on a self-serve basis. A muffin tin was provided for customers to leave their money. Later, fresh fruits and vegetables were added to the offerings.

In 1971, Bill, Sr. sold the operation to his son, Bill, Jr., who, with his wife, Judy, still owns it today.

They've remodeled three times. The last makeover, in 2014, doubled the size of their building and greatly enlarged the bakery and deli sections.

That was good timing, because Sheridan's last grocery closed right about then, turning the town into a food desert. Wilson's expansion gave Sheridan residents the option of a food source a little closer than Westfield, Noblesville or Tipton.

When I first visited Wilson's in the 1990's, they were doing a good business, but that was nothing compared to the crowds that show up today. I always count myself lucky if I can find a parking space near the building.

As good as the fried chicken is, those people aren't just coming for it. The expanded market has become a kind of general store. If you didn't know better, you'd think you were in Shipshewana from the wide variety of Amish cheeses, Yoder's meat, baked goods and other items they sell.

Another hot ticket at

Wilson's are morel mushrooms, which are usually available each spring for a very short time around the first of May. The mushrooms are sold by the box and are NOT cheap, but if you crave morels and don't have access to your own secret patch, you can get them here.

Of course, they do still sell produce, much of which is locally grown in season. They're especially known for their sweet corn.

No time to run up to 256th Street? Don't worry. You can also find their sweet corn, kettle corn, pretzels and other items at the booths they operate at the Indiana State Fair, and at other fairs, festivals and farmer's markets.
