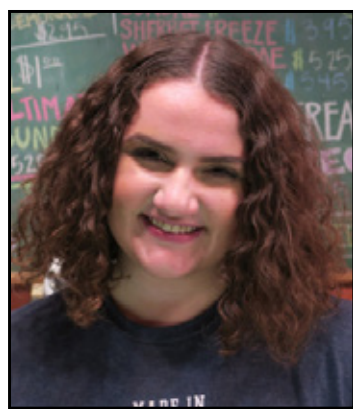

1. Fuel Supply Remedy
Governor Eric J. Holcomb yesterday signed Executive Order 22-13, suspending certain regulations in order to minimize the disruption of adequate fuel supply to Hoosiers and motorists in surrounding states after an electrical fire at the BP Whiting refinery on Aug. 24, which caused it to shut down production. The order temporarily waives regulations regarding vapor pressure requirements on fuel standards and lifts restrictions on hours of service relating to motor carriers and drivers transporting fuels. The temporary suspensions are meant to expedite the refining and transporting of fuel through Indiana. The refinery provided up to 25 percent of the refined fuel used in Indiana before the fire temporarily shuttered it. 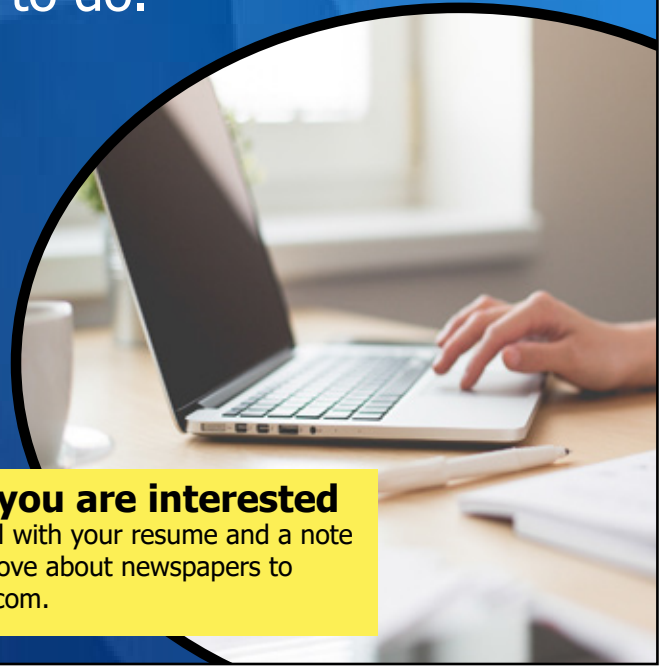

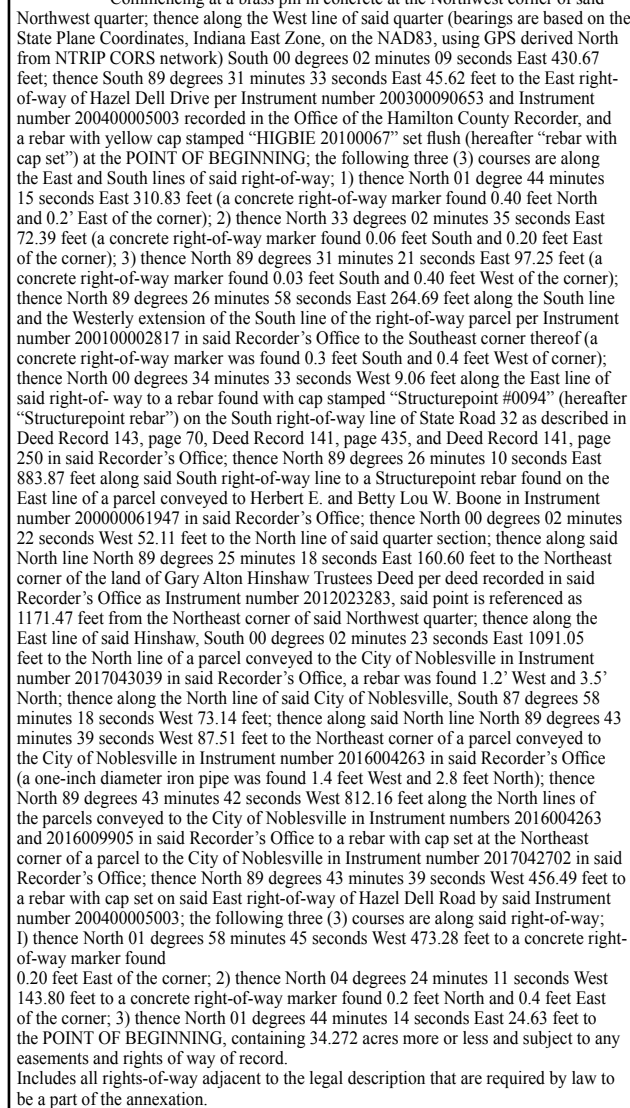

ORDINANCE NO. 51-07-22
AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF NOBLESVILLE, HAMILTON COUNTY, INDIANA
Midland Pointe
Super-Voluntary Annexation
WHEREAS, the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana received a petition requesting that certain territory generally located adjacent to the southeast intersection of State Road No. 32 (Westfield Road) and Hazel Dell Road, as herein after described (Annexation Territory"), be annexed by Noblesville; and
WHEREAS, the petition has been signed by the sole owner (i.e. 100%) of the property within the Annexation Territory; and
WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code §36-4-3-5.1 (e), on or around August 9, 2022, the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing regarding the Annexation Territory;
WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code §36-4-3-1.5, the Common Council has determined that the Annexation Territory is contiguous at least by one-eighth (1/8) of the aggregate external boundaries of the Annexation Territory and coincides with the boundaries of the City.
WHEREAS, the written fiscal plan and definite policy adopted by resolution provides for the provision of services of a non-capital nature (including police protection, fire protection, street and road maintenance and other non-capital services normally provided within the corporate boundaries of the City) to the Annexation Territory within one (1) year after the effective date of this annexation in a manner equivalent in standard and scope to those non-capital services provided to areas within the current corporate boundaries, regardless of similar topography, patterns of land use, and population density; and
WHEREAS, the written fiscal plan and definite policy adopted by resolution provides for the provision of services of a capital nature (including but not limited to street construction, sewer facilities, and storm water drainage facilities) to the Annexation Territory within three (3) years after the effective date of this annexation in a manner equivalent in standard and scope to those capital services provided to areas within the current corporate boundaries, regardless of similar topography, patterns of land use, and population density; and in a manner consistent with federal, state and local laws, procedures, and planning criteria; and
WHEREAS, the Common Council now desires to annex the Annexation Territory generally known as "Midland Pointe";
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana as follows:
Section 1. Contiguity. The petition requesting voluntary annexation for the Annexation Territory, further described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein and graphically depicted in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein.
Section 2. Annexation Territory. The real estate containing approximately 34 acres, more or less legally described in Exhibit A, and graphically depicted in Exhibit both attached thereto and incorporated herein, and generally known as Midland Pointe, is hereby annexed to and declared to be a part of the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana including all rights-of-way adjacent to this property as required by law.
Section 3. Council District. The above described real estate is hereby assigned to City Council District 2 and shall become a part thereof immediately upon the effective date of this ordinance.
Section 4. All prior Ordinances or parts thereof that may be inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby superseded. The paragraphs, sentences, words, and Annexation Territory of this Ordinance are separable, and if a court of competent jurisdiction thereof declares any portion of this Ordinance or the Annexation Territory unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the remaining portions of the Annexation Territory or this Ordinance.
Section 5. The effective date of this annexation shall be as soon as allowed by law following its adoption, execution, and publication as required by law.





Indiana's Special Legislative Session Cost Taxpayers \$240K

Indiana taxpayers were out close to a quarter of a million dollars for a special legislative session that saw the passage of a near-total ban all abortions in the state, as well as a deal providing wrap-around social services and inflation relief.

House and Senate officials provided the Indiana Capital Chronicle with data on the cost of a special session, which largely involves a per diem for legislators, as well as travel expenses.

For the two-week session that lasted from July 25 to Aug. 5, per diem costs came to \$208,858, plus another \$31,293 to compensate lawmakers for travel to and from the Statehouse. That brought the total cost of the special session to \$240,151.

Special session cost breakdown

Legislative staff previously expected the special session to cost around \$280,000, which accounted for an estimated \$246,000 in per diem costs, plus two weeks of travel at about \$35,000.

A special session costs taxpayers \$17,640 each day in per diem expenses, including weekends, for the 150 legislators, plus \$17,821 per week in travel expenses.

Lawmakers receive about \$183 in per diem costs for each day the

legislature is in session to cover meals and lodging, although they are not required to use the money for those purposes.

Legislators also receive 57 cents for each mile driven, in-line with the federal rate for mileage reimbursement.

Senate Spokeswoman Molly Fishell pointed out the regular session ended five days early in March — saving Hoosier taxpayers money. She declined to comment further on the special session expenses.

A spokesperson for the House also did not reply to a request for comment.

Holcomb initially called for legislators to convene for a special session to consider a taxpayer refund on July 6. Republican leaders delayed work until July 25, however, allowing the GOP-dominated Legislature time to craft abortion-restricting legislation following the U.S. Supreme Court decision in June to overturn Roe v. Wade.

The special legislative session prompted long days and heated debate in both chambers of the General Assembly.

One bill adopted by lawmakers outlaws all abortions except in the case of a fatal fetal anomaly and cases of serious health risk to the mother — up to 20 weeks post-fertilization. Rape survivors can get an

abortion up to 10 weeks post-fertilization.

Indiana is the first state in the nation to approve such legislation since the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade in late June. The ban takes effect on Sept. 15.

A second approved measure uses over \$1 billion in reserve accounts to send \$200 checks to millions of eligible Hoosiers. It also repeals the diaper tax, increases the adoption tax credit and allocates about \$74 million in supports needed due to an expected abortion ban.

GOP defends decision to convene

Critics argued the extended special session was unnecessary, saying that changes to Indiana's abortion law could wait until the General Assembly convenes again next year.

"We don't have to spend taxpayer dollars to come here and talk about abortion," Senate Minority Leader Greg Taylor said in July. "We have a legislative session coming up in January, and we can take care of it then."

Senate President Pro Tem Rodric Bray and other members of the Republican caucus maintained that the bills passed during the special session were "representative" of what a majority

of Hoosiers want post-Roe.

That's despite a highly-guarded poll conducted by the House and Senate GOP campaign committees that indicates Hoosiers don't want a near-virtual ban on abortion.

"I couldn't be more excited about what we've been able to do for women and children here," Bray said following the conclusion of the special session. "We're protecting life. This is very important."

The General Assembly last convened in a one-day special session in May 2018. That was after a chaotic finish to the 2018 legislative session left several of the governor's priority issues without votes before the clock ran out on the regular session.

The one-day special session — which lasted only a few hours — cost taxpayers more than \$30,000.

with my transplant went very well. The kidney was practically a perfect match for me. I know how grateful and lucky I am to have had my new kidney for 25 years now. It is very overwhelming to think about."

Nicolich and her smart, sassy and mischievous 5-year-old Golden retriever, Makena, will be among more than 100 fellow dog owners and walking enthusiasts at the 6th annual Strut 2 Save Lives on Sept. 11.

"I'll be walking to honor my donor hero and his or her family," Jill said. "I think about them and thank them every day because of the incredible gift of life they gave to me."

The one-mile Strut 2 Save Lives returns to Noblesville's Dr. James A. Dillon Park, located at 6001 Edenshall Lane on 146th Street, about a quarter mile east of Hazel Dell Road in Hamilton County. Registration begins at 10 a.m. and costs \$25 for adults, \$12 for children ages 12 and younger and \$65 for families up to five participants.

A live DJ will provide music until 1 p.m. A professional photographer will be available at no charge following the walk to capture images of pets and owners.

Strut 2 Save Lives will welcome a host of area vendors this year, including Pet Wants (dog bones and chews), Emmitt's Closet (an eclectic and herbal boutique), Finntastic Flora (indoor plants), Noblesville Rocks (jewelry made from polished rocks), MTB Creations (wooden engraved cutting boards, wine corks and more), Teter Organic Farm (organic produce and flowers), Artisan Luuma (African handbags and baskets) and County Line Apparel (T-shirts and clothing accessories). A balloon artist and dog nail trimmer plus food from E&M Hot Diggity Dogs and beer from Moontown Brewing will also be available at the event.

Once again, the business community has come together to support donation and transplantation at this event. raised in. The reception was in the church basement with cake and ice cream, and we opened our presents," she said.

How did he know that she was the one?

"Because she was beautiful and smart," he said.

"We just never thought of not being together," she said.

"I think that's because I loved her," he said.

Shirley remembers when Keith proposed marriage. "I just remember being so happy and excited."

How did she know that he was the one?

"We both had boy-friends and girlfriends before, and we knew they weren't the ones," she said.

Yes, just ask Keith Ayer the best decision he ever made in his life, and he'll tell you, "I married Shirley."

Did they ever dream of being married for 65 years?

"I think we're gonna make 70," she said last week. "But if he doesn't learn to play better bidding at Bridge, he may not."

They laughed.

Laughing together has been one of their secrets to a long and happy marriage.

"We got married. We stayed married," she said.

Both were born and raised in Wisconsin, she in Mineral Point, and he in Darlington, only 14 miles apart. Both came from working-class families. He graduated high school and went to the military, serving in the U.S. Navy for four years.

Then in college, at University of Wisconsin-Platteville, he studied agriculture, and she studied elementary education. They met just before Valentine's Day their freshman year when she was 18. They married just six months later. She was 19, and he was 24. They went on a three-day honeymoon, then came back

and went back to work. "I didn't go back to college," she said. "He did. He finished his college years."

In the meantime, he took a job in a meat market, and she went to work for a photographer.

Keith said, "We don't remember a lot of the romance in our life. We remember a lot of the work."

After they were married in August of 1957, their son Brian, was born the next July. Then Cheryl was born the following July. And then Tim was born, then Allison.

Keith was working a job doing appraisals. But he could get a better job if they moved to Noblesville, which they did in 1964, when Tim was 2.

"When we moved down here, we had to succeed," Keith said. "We had no money to move back and no place to move back to."

It was new beginnings, they said. Keith had five brothers, and Shirley came from a family of nine children. "They all stayed in the same place. We picked up and moved," said Shirley, who when they moved here taught preschool and raised their four kids.

"I was in the appraisal business for 20 years, making loans and appraisals before opening the (Ayer's) Real Estate office in 1978. We took a great gamble," he said. The couple became partners in the real-estate business.

"We made some good decisions in our life," he said.

"When Keith and I went into business, the first thing he told me: 'Make a decision. Make a decision if it's right or wrong.' And I remembered that," Shirley Ayer said.

They couldn't have asked for anything more in life.

"I don't know how we got such great kids, but we do," Shirley Ayer said.

"That's our success. If you've got a good family,

good people and they're healthy," that's all that they could ask for.

They lived in seven different houses. When they were living in Monterey Village, Keith came home one day and said, "We're going to buy a farm." So they put the house up for sale and moved to the country.

Having grown up on a farm and studying agriculture, Keith was right at home. "He's always been a farmer. The kids loved it. We bought a horse. One horse wasn't any good, so we bought two horses. Then we decided to get into 4-H. We bought pigs, calves, rabbits, and we had seven good years out of the farm," Shirley said. Now the property is a housing development.

Then they bought property in the Craig Highlands neighborhood and built a new house, where they lived for seven years. Then they bought the old McMahon house on Conner Street across from the old Conner Elementary, and then moved to St. James Place, where they now live. After 18 winters in Florida, they sold a condo there and came back to Indiana year-round, to spend more time with their grandkids. "Family is what keeps us going," she said.

They've both worked hard all of their lives and prided themselves on honesty. There were challenging times, maybe some things he'd do differently or do better. But he wouldn't change his life. "It's been a great life," he said.

"Live your life. Whatever your interest is in life, pursue it and work hard at it. Don't rely on the government or somebody else to take care of you," he said.

What else? "Money isn't everything. Just keep that in mind. But it's necessary," he said.

They have the best time in retirement spending time with their eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. And playing Bridge at the Senior Citizens Organization center in Noblesville.

"What keeps us going is, we both read. We read about a book a week. We do a thousand-piece puzzle all of the time. We have one on the table all of the time," Shirley said.

They do play a lot of bridge, Shirley four times a week and Keith a couple of times a week. "And my big thing is my volunteering," said Shirley, who volunteers three times a week at St. Vincent DePaul NobleCause resale shop in Noblesville. "The people are so great, and that keeps me going," she said. He also likes to do yardwork, although they've just given their John Deere to their grandson and now have a lawn service. But Keith still enjoys taking care of the flowers and working in the yard.

Shirley and Keith operated Ayer's Real Estate until 2003. "We walked out and turned the keys over to Brian," who now operates the business out of his Hamilton County Bail Bonds office after selling the former real-estate office on Ninth Street to make room for The Levinson, downtown Noblesville's first parking garage.

"You can't stop change," she said.

"You can either change with the future or you can be left behind," he said.

The Ayer couple said they've met a lot of good people over the years.

"Noblesville was good to us, and hopefully we were good to them."

County towns that have plat maps recorded in the old deed books in the courthouse, but, for various reasons, never existed anywhere but on paper.)

Chilicothe and a Wayne Township town, Wheatly, were planned to be on the Central Canal. However, because the canal was never finished, those towns were never built.

Wheatly's plat map includes its proposed location (today that would be the south side of 206th St. between Victory Chapel and Olio Roads,) but oddly, Chilicothe's location is missing from its map.

Jeanne said her neighbor, John Bundy of Bundy Ducks, told her Chilicothe would have been situated on high ground along the south side of White River near State Road 13.

Unfortunately, Mr. Bundy died recently, so I lost the opportunity to talk

to him about Chilicothe, but I suspect he was probably right about the location.

In other business . . . On a recent visit to Gatewood's Vegetable Farm I discovered they're selling some nice T-shirts to commemorate their 100th year.

Bruce Gatewood pointed out the clever way his son, Bryce, worked "100" into the design on the back of the shirt, and Bruce's sister, Kelli Balke, noted that the image of their building even includes the crooked weathervane.

(I'd never noticed the weathervane before, which shows how observant I am!)

Kelli said they often get asked if they intend to straighten the weathervane, but there are no plans to do that. They're used to it the way it is.

When I was writing

about Atlanta last week I ran short on space, so I couldn't include anything about why "Atlanta" was chosen as the town's name when it became necessary to replace "Buena Vista."

Actually, I'm not sure there is a definitive explanation.

The June 18, 1886, Ledger simply notes that "Beuna Vista" [sic] was changed to "the more euphonious name" of Atlanta, which "increased the enterprise and public spirit of its citizens." (In case you're wondering, "euphonious" means "pleasing to the ear.")

A more involved explanation appears in the August 7, 1914 Noblesville Daily Ledger.

F. M. (Frank) Trissal, a former Noblesville attorney living in Chicago, wrote a letter to the editor in which he stated that a regiment of Hoosier

soldiers had been accused ("perhaps wrongfully") of running away at the battle of Buena Vista during the Mexican War. He suggested that was why the town's name was changed.

(Apparently, he was unaware a Buena Vista post office already existed in Indiana.)

According to Trissal, "Atlanta" was chosen to replace "Buena Vista" because it commemorated "a great battle of the Civil War in which Indiana soldiers participated and were complimented for their bravery."

Finally — it's woolly worm time again! Please let me know if you spot any.
