# **Election Day in Hamilton County**

Yesterday was Election Day and the voters have spoken. Among the notable winners were Republican Sen. Todd Young, who resoundingly beat Democrat and former Mayor of Hammond Thomas McDermott, Jr., and Republican Rep. Victoria Spartz, who won re-election to her 2nd term over Democrat Jeannine Lee Lake.

As the debate over education has increased in fervor around the country, local school board elections have been put in the spotlight. In Noblesville,

incumbent Noblesville School Board President Joe Forgey won re-election, while newcomer Misti Ray came in second place in the at-large race.

Hamilton County Elections Administrator Beth Sheller commented on how Election Day went this year, saying, "It went smoothly, we had some people waiting in line late, but other than that everything was just normal."

Turnout was 48.12%, a 10-point decrease from the 2018 midterms and a 27-point decrease from the 2020 election. In total, 130,355 Hamilton County residents cast ballots this year, 77,171 of them on Election Day and 53,184 via walk-in and paper absentee ballots.

Sheller also commented on the turnout numbers, saying, "I expected it to be close to what the 2018 turnout was...even though it seemed busy." There were otherwise no major issues at polling locations. Noblesville School Board





"At a time when our country is faced with





Akridge, the longest-serving provost in the Big Ten currently, has been Purdue's provost and executive vice president for academic affairs and diversity since July 2017, serving first as interim before being appointed to the role in November 2017. He will take a sabbatical and then return to his faculty appointment as a professor of agricultural economics.

"Jay has been an outstanding provost, fully dedicated to the success of this institution and its faculty, staff and students," President Mitch Daniels said. "We are

grateful for his loyal and excellent service in perhaps the most strenuous and taxing job on campus. I'll especially remember his indispensable efforts through the pandemic and his leadership in our growth as a 21st-century land-grant institution. Jay has given Purdue more than 40 years of great service, and we look forward to many more."

President-elect Mung

Chiang echoed Daniels' praise. "Jay has been and will continue to be an extremely valued colleague at Purdue. I thank him deeply for his vital and outstanding contributions in so many ways to our university throughout the past four decades. We will have an event next month to formally recognize the impact of his service. With tremendous appreciation and respect for his leadership, I look forward to many successful future collaborations with him."

Purdue University announced it will begin the process of selecting its next provost by launching an internal search first, effective immediately. A search committee, led by Byron Pipes, the John L. Bray Distinguished Professor of Engineering at Purdue since 2004, has

been formed and will accept nominations and applications from within the Purdue system through Nov. 28. The search will be staffed by Amy Boyle, associate vice president of human resources. I found a couple of articles that describe the K. of P. members' move from their previous home, the Odd Fellows Lodge room on the south side of the courthouse square, to their new Castle Hall on the third floor of the Lacy building.

Both accounts were primarily concerned with how the lodge's goat took to the change of address. According to the Noblesville Democrat, "his goatship" handled it pretty well, thanks to the calming influence of the K. of P. band which headed the procession.

Seriously? Did they really mean there was a live goat?

It sure reads that way. The Hamilton County Ledger observed that "The most skeptical are now compelled to acknowledge his (the goat's) existence" and the Democrat noted that the goat was led by a Knight in a Turkish costume.

Yet, the Democrat also stated "... there is only one way to get a sight at him (the goat,) and that is to be luckly [sic] enough to gain admittance into the order."

Okay, I was confused. I did a little digging and learned that during the 19th and early 20th centuries, "riding the goat" was said to be a common part of the initiation ritual for several fraternal organizations, not just the K. of P. I even found a photo of one lodge posing with a goat.

But, did Noblesville's K. of P. actually use a live goat in their initiations? Or were the newspapers pulling everybody's leg?

I'm still not sure. One thing is certain — some lodges DID put initiates on a mechanical goat. An Illinois company even manufactured one that flipped its rider upside down, fired blanks from its rear, and emitted a "ba-a-a" to make the

goat "more goaty." Remember that the next time you think of our ancestors as staid and humorless.

see that McNally wrote a play, 'Mothers and Sons,' which takes place 20 years after the memorial," LaMonte said.

In "Mothers and Sons," Katherine pays a surprise visit to Cal, who has now married to a younger man, Will, and has a 6-year-old son, Bud. They attempt to reconcile, but you realize that Katherine has not gone on with her life, and is still holding others responsible for her actions.' "I read the script and it has been on my radar to direct for some time," said LaMonte. The play will be onstage for eight performances, through Nov. 20. Tickets are still available. "'Mothers and Sons" is a history lesson of the lives of gay men over the past two decades. The play charts the gains and losses, victories and defeats for gay men in the years since AIDS was first identified," the director said. LaMonte, who is a married gay man, said so much has changed in the lives of LGTB people in the last 20 years. "The word 'gay' is now acceptable. The fact that gays can marry and live free without fear of losing jobs or status, something I never dreamed would ever happen to the gay community in my lifetime. a 6-year-old boy played by Tyler Aquaviva, a 20-something young millennial gay man played by Nicholas Heskett, his late 40s husband who attended his partner Andre until he died of AIDS and then mourned him for eight years, played by Austin Uebelhor, and Katherine, Andre's mother, whose rage has not lessened in the two decades since her son's burial, played by Elizabeth Ruddell.

"They become a lovely quartet, each playing notes of love, loss and regret, which never grows old in theater, and neither does the complicated relationships between mothers and sons," LaMonte said.

This play ran on Broadway, in Philadelphia, Boston, Argentina and Columbus, Ohio, in these much larger cities. Basile Westfield Playhouse is now taking a chance that people will enjoy the play just as much in our theater community.

Is the play family friendly?

"I would say the play is rated PG-13. There is some profanity, and if the subject of two gay men married with a child should offend theater

goers in this day and age, then this isn't the play for them," he said.

LaMonte lives on the near northside of Indianapolis and is also an administrator for the Marion County Recorder's Office. This is his first production at Westfield, although he has been directing for nearly 25 years.

> Players last February, was among the nominations for Best Production of a Drama and Best Director of a Drama (LaMonte was the nominee), as well as 13 other nominations from the Encore Association's 53rd annual Encore Awards Ceremony on Monday at The Toby Theatre at The Indianapolis Museum of Art at Newfields. (While the play didn't win for either of the two direct or producer categories,

"Good People" did earn Molly Bellner an Encore Award for Best Lead Actress in a Drama.)

Miller offered this additional explanation that was archived in the Main Street Productions secretary's board minutes: "Main Street Productions is committed to producing shows that involve, reflect and nourish the community it serves. Artist's Choice shows may not be for everyone but they are for someone. If you're looking for something different on the stage, join us for Artist's Choice."
