

1. Spartz Statement

Remembering Clean Laundry



PAULA DUNN From Time to Thyme

In the last reader column, I tried tracing the history of the old laundromat building, one of the structures at the intersection of Noblesville's Tenth and Pleasant Streets that was recently razed for the Pleasant Street project.

That column prompted a response from Martha Tunget Spurrier. Martha has good reason to remember that building — her parents, John and Catharine Tunget, constructed it in 1952-53 to house their laundry business.

The C & J Laundry opened at 726 S. Tenth Street in February of 1953 — complete with a neon sign in front!

The new laundry boasted all new equipment: 11 Bendix washers, a special 25-pound washer, two dryers and two extractors. (Extractors spun really fast and extracted excess water which cut drying time.)

Both self-service and regular (drop-off) service were avail-

The following May, the Tungets also opened Tunget's Appliances in the new building. Martha's brother, Harvey, who had just returned from serving in the army, was the store's manager.

Tunget's Appliances sold Capehart televisions and radios, Gibson refrigerators, Toastmas-

Susan S. Gorby August 13, 1943-February 6, 2023

Susan S. Gorby, 79, died peacefully in the early morning of Feb. 6, 2023, surrounded by loving family,

in Noblesville, where she resided. Mrs. Gorby was a lifelong learner whose love of books, particularly children's literature and storytelling, inspired her professional and volunteer work in libraries. She held a Bachelor of Arts in English and a Master of



Arts in Student Personnel Administration, and in her early career was employed in student counseling services at Ohio Wesleyan University and Indiana University. While raising her two children, she worked at the Michigan City Public Library, and later led a volunteer program to expand library services at Shawmut Hills Elementary School in Grand Rapids, Mich., where her children attended. After a divorce in 1995, she received a Master of Arts in Counseling Psychology and Holistic Health from Western Michigan University, and was the coordinator for the displaced homemaker program at the Women's Resource Center in Grand Rapids, counseling women seeking to re-enter the workforce unexpectedly after 20 or more years in caregiving roles.

Mrs. Gorby was born Susan Margaret Spiers on Aug. 13, 1943, in Michigan City, Ind., the daughter of the late Albert and Lois (Ericson) Spiers. She met the love of her life, James D. Gorby, of Sparta, Mich., through mutual friends in Grand Rapids. The two married on September 7, 2002, and moved to Clifton, Va. With Mr. Gorby, she discovered a love of world travel and cruising, but her greatest inspiration after retirement was her relationship with her grandchildren, who she said kept her young, active and fearless.

She is survived by her loving husband of 20 years, James D. Gorby of Noblesville, Ind.; two children, Christopher (Nikol) Elliott of Sterling, Va., and Katherine Raz (Jem Hilton) of Lakewood, Wash.; three grandsons, Malcolm, Eero, and Remy; sister, Sally Spiers of Indianapolis, Ind.; and a brother, Richard Spiers (Johanna Lewis) of Spartanburg, S.C.; as well as four step children and four step grandchildren.

White Family Foundation Makes \$50M Commitment to Purdue Business School

The Dean and Barbara White Family Foundation has committed \$50 million to Purdue University to name the undergraduate institute in the Mitchell E. Daniels, Jr. School of Business.

This commitment represents the lead gift to establish the school and the largest monetary contribution ever made to Purdue's School of Management/Business. The initiative to relaunch the School of Business, which began while Daniels was university president, will continue to be championed by new President Mung Chiang and the Board of Trustees

The institute will be named the Bruce White Undergraduate Institute. White (M '75), who died on Jan. 19, was founder and chairman of White Lodging, a former member of the Purdue Board of Trustees, and a longtime university benefactor.

"The White Family Foundation has long been a truly dedicated partner in helping Purdue achieve excellence at scale. The naming after Bruce White, one of the most prominent Boilermakers our university has ever known, is particularly meaningful to us," Chiang said. "This gift ensures Purdue will educate exceptional undergraduate business students who will create and grow competitive businesses in a technology-driven, free-market economy.

Announced in September 2022 as Purdue's next big move in a decadelong series of major strategic investments, the new school will build on the rich heritage and historic strengths of the School of Management and Krannert Graduate School. This gift will help restructure and scale innovative degrees and provide transformational education experiences for undergraduate students.

The Bruce White Undergraduate Institute will serve as a flagship element of the Daniels School of Business. The Krannert name will be retained for the Krannert Graduate Institute. The new names of both institutes are subject to



approval by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees in the coming days.

"Purdue is recognized as a dynamic national leader in higher education, where it has redefined the meaning of value. As such, Purdue is seen as a strategic partner of our foundation," said Bill Hanna, executive director of the White Family Foundation. "Bruce was an instrumental part of Purdue's progress over the last decade and more, working closely with senior university leadership as both a trustee and a dedicated alum. He represents a true north that students can look to as a model, and the White Family Foundation is proud to support the Bruce White Undergraduate Institute."

To create a revised curriculum that equips graduates to lead at the intersection of business and technology, the Daniels School will identify the best aspects of its top existing programs and build on the success of new degree pilots launched between fall 2021 and fall 2022.

These pilot programs include the integrated business and engineering (IBE) and business analytics programs. IBE launched with twice the number of expected students, and the new school's goal is to grow the number of IBE and business analytics degree students to 1,600 — a full 40% of its undergraduate population.

Another successful new program, for a real estate finance minor, is, in fact, part of an earlier transformational commitment from the White Family Foundation. That gift, a \$20.8 million commitment announced in April 2022, launched the Dean

UNIVERSITY V. White Real Estate Finance program — and initiated conversations to reinvent the School of Management as a School of Business.

"The White Family Foundation's commitment to an increasingly prominent Purdue inspired us to imagine a business school that addresses the need to reshape business education and produce technology-based graduates who build and lead successful companies," Daniels said. "Their gifts provide tremendous momentum to realize our goals."

Additional goals for the Daniels School include: Increasing enrollment to 4,000 undergraduates and 2,000 graduate students

Growing tenure-track and clinical faculty significantly this decade.

by 2028.

Adding additional square footage to current business facilities to accommodate program growth, with 2027 as the target move-in date.

Alumni and friends of Purdue have rallied to support the Daniels School of Business, committing more than \$127 million so far to increase the school's capacity for excellence at scale. The Board of Trustees has committed funds for the initiative, as well. An initial investment of \$300 million will jump-start growth and establish Purdue's program as the standard for an affordable, technology-focused, pro-business business education.

"The transformation of our business school is a huge part of our future as a university, and this gift is a testament to the legacies of Bruce White, the White family and Purdue," said Mike Berghoff, chairman of the Purdue Board of Trustees. "We have always taken pride in how much we invest in our undergraduate students. This commitment reinforces our mission."

The White family has been a prominent con-

tributor to Purdue over the past three decades, including a combined gift of \$30 million that helped transform the Union Club Hotel. The hotel serves as both the university's boutique on-campus lodging option and a learning laboratory for students studying hospitality at Purdue.


"My brother Bruce was a phenomenal human being," said Craig White, president of the board of trustees at the White Family Foundation.

"His success in business was tremendous, but his success as a person and as a leader is even more impressive — he put his heart and soul into every aspect of his life, and he has inspired countless other people to do the same. Naming the undergraduate program after him couldn't be more natural."

Also, in 2021, Purdue renamed its hospitality and tourism school the White Lodging-J.W. Marriott, Jr. School of Hospitality and Tourism Management in honor of the company's ongoing support and partnership.

"Bruce was a wonderful husband, father and friend," Beth White said. "He was successful in his personal and business life because he was himself in all settings. Integrity was not just a word to Bruce; it was foundational. His values were matched by a tremendous drive to constantly improve in all aspects of life, to never accept the status quo and to have the courage to ask the tough questions even of himself. When a leader like that shows up. things become dynamic. Everyone is inspired to give their best, and a journey toward excellence begins. Our family is very honored and pleased to know that the values and qualities Bruce lived by will be instilled and replicated in future generations of leaders who get their start at the Bruce White Undergraduate Institute."

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

productions.

In high school, acting took a backseat, as she turned her attention toward academics. But the acting bug returned when her daughter showed an interest. They did shows together at church, The Belfry Theatre in Noblesville and at Westfield Playhouse.

When her daughter got busy with other things, the mom kept going on her own. And she's been acting on stage ever since.

Weaver is currently performing in her 48th show since she took up acting as an adult. (She has also worked backstage and in the tech booth for another 10-12 shows.)

Currently, she plays the role of Aouda, an Indian princess, in The Belfry Theatre's "Around the World in 80 Days," a comedy on stage Friday through Sunday at Arts for Lawrence's Theater at the Fort. The Belfry has also moved its next two productions -- "The Great Gatsby" and "Crimes of the Heart," to the Lawrence venue, about 25 minutes south of Noblesville, due to the inability to find available stage space in and around Noblesville.

"There are a couple of things that make this show unique," Weaver said. "There are many different characters (39 actually) that enter the story for a brief time, and these characters are all played by just a few actors (only six)," she said. Actors are changing voices, mannerisms and costumes continually to bring these different characters to life. "For that role (of Aouda), I had to learn to wear a saree (a garment traditionally worn in India), and to put it on very quickly," she said.

The other unique aspect is sound, she said. Eric Dixon, who plays a foley artist, produces all of the sound effects from his spot on the left side of the stage (stage right), using coconut shells, washboards, a pool noodle and trombone. Some sound effects (but not all) were listed in the script but it was Dixon and the show director Eric Matters who decided what sounds would enhance the show. And Dixon is quite interesting to watch as he has to keep up his sound effects with what is going on onstage, including using washboards to make train chugging sounds that slow down and speed up.

She auditioned for the show because she enjoys the opportunity to play multiple roles. Although, as it turned out, the role she was cast in only plays a couple of parts; the second role is of "an old English curmudgeon who bet Phileas Fogg that he could not travel around the world in 80 days," she

But she's enjoyed watching the other actors create their different characters. In this show, the characters travel seven continents in Mark Brown's adaptation of one of the greatest adventures of all time,

according to the play's synopsis.

She loves playing multiple roles. For instance, in 'Red, White and Tuna,' directed by Ron Richards at The Belfry, she portrayed seven characters, made 16 costume changes and donned three different wigs. In her last show, "Christmas Spirit" at Mud Creek, she played a character who was 15 years older than her. (She was thrilled when a patron called her "believable" in her role, a great compliment, Weaver said.)

"I enjoy playing all kinds of roles and like to challenge myself," she

Besides The Belfry and Westfield Playhouse, she has performed at five other community theaters, Carmel Community Players, Carmel Theatre Co., Epilogue Players, Improbable Fiction and Mud Creek Players.

Being that The Belfry has temporarily become a traveling theater, staging productions at rented venues, and always on the lookout for nearby rehearsal and audition space, she said the cast and crew moved into the space just six days before opening night, adding challenges. And while Theatre at the Fort is spacious, "the downside is that it is not in Hamilton County and is farther for most of our loyal patrons," she said.

Weaver grew up in the northern suburbs of Chicago and graduated from the University of Illinois with a degree in computer science. She is a technical project director at Elevance Health. She and her husband, Mike, who will celebrate their 33rd anniversary this year, have a son in Chicago and a daughter in Cincinnati. The Weavers like to travel and hike and volunteer at Teter Organic Farm in Noblesville, and she also sings in the Noblesville First **United Methodist Church** choir and likes to read and paint.

Weaver said she doesn't usually have too much difficulty learning lines for shows. She records all of the lines using a Line Learner phone application and works on them while she walks and whenever she's in the car.

And as far as learning comedy, Weaver said there are a "few keys to doing comedy well." She said, "One is to portray real characters who might say or do funny things but that are not trying to be funny. Another is timing. You need to really listen to what everyone else is saying and make your lines sound natural ... You also need to listen to the audience and be ready to hold for laughs."

ter water heaters and Bendix appliances, like the Bendix Duomatic, the 'world's first and only combination washer-dry-

The appliance store only lasted a short time. Later that year Harvey Tunget began concentrating solely on his refrigeration service and in 1954 he became the owner of Noblesville's original Dairy Queen.

The C & J Laundry may have been new, but John and Catharine Tunget were no strangers to the laundry business. In 1948, they'd opened Noblesville's first self-service laundry at the corner of 12th and Hannibal Streets.

According to the Noblesville Daily Ledger, several such businesses existed in Indianapolis at that time, and Anderson had two, but the Tungets' was the first in Hamilton County

The 12th and Hannibal laundry was described as a fireproof, well-ventilated, cool cement block building with "modern fluorescent lighting.'

It was equipped with 20 automatic Launderall washing machines that allowed housewives (washing clothes was still considered women's work!) to do their family's entire weekly washing in 40 minutes "with practically no effort on the part of the housewife except to take the dirty clothes to the laundry and carry the clean ones home . . . '

Gas dryers were provided for anyone who wanted to dry their clothes before returning home. (I guess a lot of people still hung their clothing outside to dry.)

The Ledger noted that special soap would be furnished for the Launderall

machines and that customers' soapy water would be completely changed after each wash so that "clothes belonging to different parties will not be mixed or

washed together.'

Martha recalled that people paid at the counter, then they could load the machines and turn them on themselves. It cost 70 cents a load to wash and dry if the laundry was dropped off. She wasn't sure about the charge for customers who did their own wash, but she thought that was 60

Martha helped out at the family business evenings, on Saturdays and during her school vacations, which led to a funny story.

Her father intended for the laundry to be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. but there wasn't that much traffic at night, so Martha began telling people they closed at 6 p.m. so she could participate in school activities.

Martha said her mother was well aware of what she was doing and sided with her, but her father never did find out

Another funny story she passed along — a couple of times Martha's mother found a dirty diaper in laundry that had been dropped off. She just wrapped the diaper up and sent it back to the custom-

In 1959, the Tungets sold the business to Mr. and Mrs. Dean A. Rees, and the C & J Laundry became the "U-Do We Do Washette."


