NHS Theater Students Apply Classroom Learning On Stage While Sharing 1861 History

Not only do Noblesville High School students involved in the spring play learn about acting, building sets, costuming, stage lighting and sound, the students are also learning about history this semester.

"Mrs. Packard" -- onstage at 7 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday in the NHS Auditorium -- is a play based on historical events, set in Illinois in 1861, and tells the fascinating story of Elizabeth Packard (1816-1897) and her struggle to right a system gone wrong after her minister husband had

her removed from their home against her will, due to her liberal beliefs, and committed to a state-run insane asylum.

At the time, a husband could have his wife committed without either a public hearing or her consent.

"Mrs. Packard," a play written by Emily Mann in 2007, was winner of the Kennedy Center Fund for New American Plays.



"The outdoor warning sirens are intended to warn those who are outdoors. Because sirens are not intended to warn those indoors, we recommend every household and business to have a weather radio," said Shane Booker, Executive Director of Emergency Management. To learn more about outdoor warning sirens in Hamilton County, please visit www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov/235/Outdoor-WarningSirens.

Sirens are only sounded when:

1. The National Weather Service issues a tornado warning – visit

https://www.weather. gov/safety/tornado-ww for more information

2. When public safety personnel sees a funnel cloud or tornado

3. When a trained weather spotter sees a funnel cloud or tornado

When the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning, a message will be sent to cell phones in the county area near the warning. FEMA, which manages the **Emergency Alert System** and the Wireless Emergency Alerts, is working to improve alerts to only those in the warned area. **Emergency Management** uses the same system to send non-weather-related emergencies to cell phones and weather radios. Alerts can include hazardous materials warnings, shelter-in-place warnings, law enforcement warnings, and more.

Emergency Management recommends everyone have a plan for severe weather, an emergency kit with supplies for at least three days, and multiple ways to receive warnings, such as a weather radio and the free HCEM mobile app. Resources to help you prepare for severe weather, emergencies, and disasters are available at www.ready. gov. The website also includes information and games to help children understand emergency preparedness.

Our Man Inside Carter Administration



PAULA DUNN From Time to Thyme

When I heard the sad news about former President Jimmy Carter entering hospice care, my thoughts automatically drifted back to Noblesville's man in the Carter White House, Tim

Kraft. I never met him, but I sure knew his father, Dr. Haldon Kraft. Dr. Kraft delivered me and was my doctor through my high school years. Besides being a good doctor, Dr. Kraft was a very civicminded individual. Tim Kraft inherited his dad's dedication to volunteerism and public service. After graduating from Dartmouth College with a degree in government in 1963, he spent two years with the Peace Corps in Guatemala. He also inherited the family allegiance to the Democratic Party. Upon returning to the States, he entered the world of politics.

In the mid-1960s, he worked for Indiana Senator Birch Bayh and in 1970 he helped with the first (and unsuccessful) congressional campaign of future Indiana Congressman Phil Sharp. The following year Kraft moved to New Mexico, where he'd trained for his stint in the Peace Corps. His work there as a consultant to the Bernalillo County Democratic Party led to him being named

executive director of the New Mexico Democratic Party.

It was through his fundraising efforts on behalf of the New Mexico Democrats that he met Jimmy Carter. In the fall of 1974, Carter, who was then governor of Georgia, came to New Mexico to speak at a dinner for the Democratic candidate for governor of that state. During the visit, Carter let it be known he was planning to announce

December. When Carter returned to New Mexico in January as an official presidential candidate, Kraft arranged a two-day trip through the state for him and got to know him well. Thoroughly impressed by the Georgia peanut farmer, Kraft kept in touch with Carter's people

time member of Carter's campaign staff. At that time, most people's reaction to Carter's candidacy was "Jimmy Who? That soon changed, due in no small part to Kraft's efforts. Put in charge of Carter's Iowa campaign, Kraft's tireless work resulted in Carter coming out on top at the Iowa caucuses and being recognized for the first time as a genuine contender for the

presidency. After Carter defeated Gerald Ford that November, Kraft was rewarded with the job of Appointments Secretary to the President. Tucked into a small cubicle next to the Oval Office, he acted as the President's gatekeeper, organizing Carter's daily schedules. In 1978 Kraft was

promoted to Carter's inner circle of advisors, becoming the presidential assistant for political and personnel affairs.

The following year, when Carter was scheduled to address Hoosier Democrats at the annual Jefferson-Jackson Dinner in Indianapolis, Kraft came with him. Members of Kraft's family attended the event and heard Carter praise Kraft. They also got to meet briefly with the President after his speech. (The fundraiser is now known as the "Hoosier Hospitality Dinner.") Two months later, Kraft was tapped to run

Carter's 1980 re-election campaign. In September, 1980, right before the election, Kraft was accused of having used cocaine during his time as Appointments Secretary. Concerned that fallout from the accusation might damage Carter's reelection bid, Kraft took a

campaign. Like Hamilton Jordan, the other top Carter aide who'd been similarly accused a year earlier, Kraft was exonerated of the charge, but not until the following March, too late to try to help Carter remain in the White

House.

play director, said a student who was exposed to this play in a summer theater program, suggested Nieten read the play. "While reading it, I fell in love with the story," she said. "Elizabeth's journey towards freedom and advocacy is very inspiring."

Nieten said "Mrs. Packard" is a good teaching play. Students today have seen adults on two sides of an issue tear each other down and try to censor or bury the thoughts and speech of the opposition. 'Adults who behave that way in society ignore and threaten the First Amendment," she said. "I wanted students to see what can happen when people go too far to try to silence the voices of opposition. To quote Elizabeth (Packard) in Act II: 'In America, we do not lock up those with whom we disagree. And whosoever seeks to do so is a traitor to our flag and the cause

which it represents." The community will find this historical drama "inspiring" when they "learn of what Elizabeth had to endure on her journey to freedom and advocacy," Nieten said. "Because she is a real person, it's a great way to learn a little history while spending a night at the theater.

Elizabeth Packard went on to advocate for women in similar situations as well as advocate for cleaner and safer conditions for asylums and became a national celebrity and published author of many books. Laws to protect people in asylums, and to protect people from asylums, were passed due to her advocacy

More than 60 NHS students, grades 9-12, are involved in the play, as cast or crew members. Students auditioned for

roles and applied to be on

Being that the play is set in 1861, it was important to find or make costumes that suggest the time period. Nieten said the costume crew was selected based on prior experience, interest and/or skills that include sewing. "We have been able to costume the entire show from our stock or from what students can bring in for themselves," said Nieten, who tries not to purchase costumes. "I do this to keep the cost down for the kids involved," she

Nieten said the stage serves as a theatrical space that becomes many places: Ward 7, Ward 8, Dr. McFarland's office, a mess hall and the Lunatics Ball, all set in an asylum. There are also courtroom scenes and a scene in the Packard home.

NHS Technical Theatre classes have built the set, and students from those classes have painted the sets and some of the furniture. Students use flats (easy-to-move lightweight timber frames covered with scenic canvas to make backdrops), furniture and lighting to create different locations.

The popularity of NHS theater classes has grown in recent years.

Before the 2015-16 school year, there were Theatre Arts I and II and Theatre Production and Technical Theatre. Now, NHS offers all of those, plus Advanced Theatre Arts I & II and Advanced Acting I & II.

In the acting-based classes, students learn "how to create characters, how to speak and move on the stage and how to put together and build scenes with an audience in mind," Nieten said. Other topics are also included,

like auditions, theater advocacy, stage makeup and preparing for competitive acting competitions.

In the Theatre Production class, students learn set construction in a first-semester course with the class building the set for the NHS fall musical. In Technical Theatre, students build the set for the spring play with the instruction focusing on sound and stage lighting.

Students not only do costumes but they also operate the sound board and light board.

"Mr. (Greg) Richards (NHS's technical director) will sit with me and the student running lights while he instructs the student on how to set up and use the board for this show," said Nieten, who is there to explain what she wants from the sound and lights. The student is in the Technical Theatre class and has some experience already with running lights. The same is true with sound, Nieten said, however, the Technical Theatre class has already covered sound this semester so the student is more self-sufficient.

It's been four years since NHS Theatre Department put on a drama, which was "The Crucible," in 2019.

Currently, students are not charged a fee to be involved with the spring

NHS Theatre doesn't get a budget from the school for productions but simply operates from ticket sales and from donations, which are accepted during the run of the play and throughout the school

Indiana Hangs Up On Robocalls

Indiana Attorney General Todd Rokita recently obtained judgments shutting down a massive robocall operation that has blasted billions of illegal robocalls to people across the country, including in Indiana. In 2019 and 2020 alone, the defendants bombarded Hoosiers with more than 25 million robocalls.

"Winning the war on robocallers requires constantly staying on offense and tracking the latest technologies the scammers are using to carry out their schemes," Rokita said. "We have pledged to do that since we first took office, and we continue to make good on that promise." Defendants in this case include John Caldwell Spiller II and his business partner Jakob Mears, the owners of Texas-based Rising Eagle Capital Group LLC and JSquared Telecom LLC, as well as Rising Eagle Capital Group-Cayman. The Office of the

Attorney General sued the defendants in June 2020 alleging violations of the federal Telephone **Consumer Protection** Act and the federal Telemarketing Sales Rule, as well as various state consumer protection laws. The complaint alleged that defendants used their companies to perpetrate scams involving extended car warranties and health care services, among other things. The defendants also spoofed calls to mislead consumers and called people on Do Not Call lists. The 25 million Hoosiers called in 2019 and 2020 included more than 13.5 million calls to people whose numbers were on the Do Not Call Registry and 5 million calls to Hoosiers on the Indiana Do Not Call List

Texas. Mears and Spiller are now permanently banned from 1) initiating or facilitating any robocalls, 2) working in or with companies that make robocalls, or 3) engaging in any telemarketing. The court also ordered monetary judgements totaling more than \$244 million for Spiller and Mears combined though these payments will be largely suspended in favor of the permanent operational bans and because of their inability to pay. Rokita's legal action in this matter isn't over. The attorneys general are continuing their cases in this same litigation against Florida-based Scott Shapiro, Michael Theron

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

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

other resources to help in the recovery process. Recovery Café Hamilton County is currently equipped to have around 40 members at one time.

"We welcome people from all walks of life," Executive Director Joylynn Foli says. "It doesn't have to be that you're recovering from substances or mental illness. It's really anybody who wants to come and have a safe, loving place."

Recovery Cafés have shown promising results. According to Foli, "Communities with Recovery Cafés see less emergency room visits and accidental overdoses."

Additionally, when utilizing the resources the Recovery Café offers, "Ninety-five percent of individuals report an improvement in their wellbeing and mental health," Foli said.

Recovery Café Hamilton County is one of 18 Recovery Cafés in the state, and more are set to open in the coming months.

"Indiana has more Recovery Cafés than any state in the country," said Huntsinger, Director for Drug Prevention, Treatment and Enforcement for the state. "Indiana is a national leader when it comes to helping people enter and sustain recovery, and the work and expansion of our Cafés is a true testament to that model."


