Noblesville Schools, Noblesville Girls Softball Association Partner On New Fields

The Noblesville Schools Board of Trustees recently approved a partnership agreement with the Noblesville Girls Softball Association (NGSA) that will bring new softball fields to North, Hinkle Creek, Stony Creek and Promise Road elementary schools.

NGSA has historically used fields on property owned by Crownland Cemetery but have been asked to vacate that space to make room for an upcoming cemetery expansion.

Noblesville Schools has stepped in to ensure that NGSA had the field space needed to continue to run their programming.

"These NGSA players are in many cases our Noblesville Schools students and we wanted to be sure their facility needs were met without disruption," said David Hortemiller, chief financial officer for Noblesville Schools. "I'm pleased we were able to partner on these new fields and am excited to see them used by NGSA, Noblesville Schools students and families, and the community at large."

Construction activities are scheduled to take place in October and will include resurfacing, enhancing fencing and backstops, and relocating dugouts and bleachers. Beaver Materials is donating supplies, storage, labor, and equipment in support of the project.

The elementary fields will be NGSA's home for the next few years while the organization searches for a permanent location to accommodate all their needs in one facility.

Noblesville Schools will then maintain the elementary fields for ongoing use by students and the community.

NGSA was founded in 2007 and provides fall and spring programming for approximately 300 Noblesville girls ages 4-18. Their leagues also support softball in Westfield, Fishers, Sheridan, Tipton, Lapel, Arcadia and Cicero.

Already having lawn chairs in the back of our car, we picked up some food, packed our sweatshirts and headed for the Noblesville City Hall parking lot.

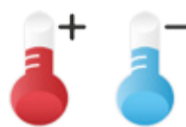
We were the only passengers waiting for a trolley ride. We only waited about five to seven minutes, and there was a trolley rolling in to pick up riders.

2024 Buick Enclave Finds Presidential Luxury At Wright-Patterson Air Force Base

I'm the kind of guy who likes a luxury car, but doesn't feel the need to scream with a glitzy badge. Don't get me wrong, I enjoy vehicles like the Cadillac XT6 three-row crossover, but sometimes it's nice to arrive elegantly without throwing down. That's where the 2024 Buick Enclave Avenir comes in. Avenir is to Buick what Denali is to GMC: Legit American luxury with none of the drama.

So, where does one take such a conveyance to experience the height of American luxury travel? Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio for a start. Because, why? The museum houses "Air Force One" airplanes used by Presidents Roosevelt through both Bushes. There's also other cool stuff among hundreds of airplanes like a B2 stealth bomber, SR-71 Blackbird, and Memphis Belle. Fortunately, the base is only two hours away.

The Enclave shares its

architecture and technology with the Cadillac XT6, but trades ostentation for understated comfort. Sure, the softer leather is diamond-stitched, wood looks carved from real timber, and the leather-wrapped steering wheel is heated. Front seats are heated, ventilated, and massage too. Rear captain's chairs are heated and everybody stays comfortable with tri-zone automatic climate control under a dual-pane sunroof.

There's more to indulge. Crank up the crisp Bose audio system and connect devices via Apple CarPlay and Android Auto. Charge wirelessly too. I'd like to have a proper tuning knob to go with volume, but the touchscreen is super intuitive with icons for audio, phone, and navigation. I liked the push-button gear selector and head-up display too. Safety is serious business given automatic emergency braking, lane keep assist, blind spot

warning, and safety alert seat that buzzes the driver's perch in direction of danger.

Jetting to Dayton was no problem given the 3.6-liter V6 delivering 310 horsepower and 266 lb.-ft. of torque. I wouldn't complain if they added a couple of turbochargers, but Buicks are more about confident motoring than ripping rubber

from tires. It's no GNX. Besides, routing that amount of power through a nearly imperceptible nine-speed transmission nets 17/25-MPG city/highway – downright frugal for a non-hybrid three-row crossover.

I especially appreciated the adaptive suspension with five-link rear set-up. No matter the road, the chassis absorbs whatever comes at it and stays controlled despite this being a pretty hefty high-riding mini-bus. Unlike a prestigious German crossover I recently tested that drunkenly wallowed through corners, the Enclave's adaptive suspension was superb. In Touring mode, it wafts down the Interstate, but click into Sport mode and it firms up corners and plants it off of bridges.

I couldn't resist photos in front of the museum where the Enclave glistened in the reflection of the building's stainless facade. The Enclave looks so at home with its tri-color badge hung on a wing of its own. It's pretty hard to upstage Raymond Lowey's iconic blue and white paint scheme on Air Force One, but GM's designers expertly styled this large three-row crossover with thin LED headlamps, 20" wheels, and even a hint of mid-century sweeppear in the side sculpting. Look close at the side vents to see three on each side, echoing historic portholes that count cylinders.

Back in the day, it was said Doctors bought Buicks instead of Cadillacs because they didn't want to look like they

were getting rich off patients. They were cars with unquestioned luxury, but understated branding. The Enclave Avenir is that kind of car, but it comes with a luxury price. Enclave starts at \$44,800, but came to \$62,095 in Avenir trim. Competitors include the Lincoln Nautilus, Acura MDX, Mercedes-Benz GLE, and Jeep Grand Cherokee. Storm Forward!

Trump And Hoosier Republicans ... Well, It's Complicated

The relationship between Donald J. Trump and Hoosier Republicans is, well, complicated.

"Americans simply love villains and in Donald Trump they have found one."

Trump's most ardent supporters appeared to be legendary coaches Bobby Knight, Gene Keady and Lou Holtz.

And then in the May 2016 Indiana presidential primary, he clinched the nomination, winning 53% of the vote against three other candidates. Gov. Pence joined his ticket, bringing with him crucial evangelical support, helping Trump secure the most improbable upset in American history while helping Eric Holcomb defeat John Gregg in the gubernatorial race and Todd Young's Senate race upset of dynastic Democrat Evan Bayh.

The fledgling administration was formed with some two dozen Hoosiers at cabinet and sub-cabinet level positions and on the White House staff. U.S. Sen. Dan Coats would become director of National Intelligence; Alex Azar would head the sprawling Health & Human Services; Dr. Jerome Adams would be surgeon general; Seema Verma, director of Medicare/Medicaid; Ted McKinney would be under-secretary at the USDA; Kip Tom was named ambassador to the United Nations food program.

It was a rollicking four years, with the Trump administration facing the COVID-19 pandemic and an array of controversies resulting in two impeachments. The president would fire Director Coats by tweet.

After losing the 2024 election by more than 7 million votes and 306-223 in the Electoral College, Trump commenced a path that resulted in

the Jan. 6 U.S. Capitol insurrection and a banana republic-style coup d'etat that would ultimately be thwarted by Republicans, including Mike Pence.

As the smoke cleared from the Capitol insurrection, Hoosiers serving in the Trump administration began to bail. Pence said in March at the Reagan Library, "President Trump was wrong. I had no right to overturn the election. What happened that day was a disgrace."

Verma said she was "repulsed" by the Jan. 6 mob. Azar resigned, citing in his letter to Trump, "The attacks on the Capitol were an assault on our democracy and on the tradition of peaceful transitions of power." Dr. Adams cited the "Trump hangover."

Asked by The New York Times earlier this year if renominating Trump would be a mistake, John Hammond said, "We can't be a cult of personality any longer." Coats, writing a New York Times op-ed in October 2020, said, "The most urgent task American leaders face is to ensure that the election's results are accepted as legitimate. Electoral legitimacy is the essential linchpin of our entire political culture."

On Tuesday, U.S. Sen. Todd Young told Republicans that Trump was poised to lose the 2024 election if nominated for a third time, suggesting to the IndyStar, "Someone who can actually win come next November."

But not all have bailed. In addition to Rep. Banks, the gubernatorial field rallied to Trump. U.S. Sen. Mike Braun called the Georgia indictments "another attempt by President Biden and his party's prosecutors to

put their leading political rival behind bars and interfere with the 2024 presidential election." Lt. Gov. Suzanne Crouch told the NWI Times that DOJ was in a "war on conservatives" that "continues unabated and without shame." Fort Wayne businessman Eric Doden said the charges "degrade our entire election process."

These candidates fear alienating the Trump base.

In Georgia, two Republicans - Gov. Brian Kemp and Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger - both refused to go along with Trump's scheme to subvert the will of voters in 2020-21. They were appalled at Trump's 2020 actions that lost two GOP Senate seats and the majority. Both earned Trump's wrath. And both were reelected in 2022 by landslide margins.

Gov. Kemp said on Tuesday, "The 2020 election in Georgia was not stolen. For nearly three years now, anyone with evidence of fraud has failed to come forward — under oath — and prove anything in a court of law. Our elections in Georgia are secure, accessible, and fair and will continue to be as long as I am governor. The future of our country is at stake in 2024 and that must be our focus."

And Raffensperger tweeted, "The most basic principles of a strong democracy are accountability and respect for the Constitution and rule of law. You either have it, or you don't."

Spam E-Mail Takes Toll On Environment



1.6 million times.

Between the energy required to harvest addresses, store unread messages in data centers for long periods of time, filter spam and complete basic processing and transmission of messages, spam email is estimated to consume 22 billion kilowatt-hours annually. The same amount of energy could power 2.3 million homes in the United States. And assuming the electricity is coming from fossil fuel sources, 2.6 billion trees would have to be planted every year to offset the pollution.

Dear EarthTalk: Is it true that spam email takes a huge toll on the environment?

If you are among the 92 percent of Americans who use email as a means of communication, you are a recipient of unsolicited batch emails called "spam." Every day, upwards of 14.5 billion spam emails are sent globally. They may seem harmless on the surface, but the storage, sorting and transmission of unnecessary spam emails consume copious amounts of energy, contributing to greenhouse gas emissions.

Emails may seem to appear somewhat magically on a phone or laptop, but any kind of electronic request actually requires a physical touchpoint, called a data center, for the information to be transmitted. Data centers need enormous amounts of electricity to function. Everything, from the servers to the infrastructure to cool the extensive computer systems, is powered by electricity. In 2014, data centers in the United States consumed 70 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity which is equivalent to around two percent of all annual American electricity consumption (the amount of electricity that data centers consume today is likely far higher). Electricity is frequently generated from fossil fuels, and fossil fuels release greenhouse gasses into the atmosphere when burned. A high demand for electricity from data centers significantly contributes to the high volume of greenhouse gas emissions.

Therefore, every email sent and received has a carbon footprint. Mike Berners-Lee, a professor at Lancaster University, determined that each spam email has a carbon footprint of 0.3g of carbon dioxide. While a spam email's carbon footprint is actually less than the average non-spam email's carbon footprint, spam email accounts for the majority of all emails sent, according to some reports—and volume matters. One spam email has the same carbon footprint as driving just three feet in a car, but the total annual volume of spam has the same carbon footprint as driving around the world

Luckily, spam is unnecessary and there are steps you can take to limit its presence in your own inbox, and to make your inbox greener. Deleting emails, clearing your spam inbox regularly, and unsubscribing from unwanted subscriptions reduces the amount of data volume being transmitted between servers and stored, which reduces demand for electrical energy. You can also choose a cloud provider, like Gmail or Microsoft Outlook, that has pledged to make their data centers carbon neutral or more environmentally friendly. Green cloud providers use a renewable electricity source or have vastly improved the electrical efficiency of their data centers. In choosing your cloud provider, take a look at Brainwave's ranking of the "Greenest Clouds." The impact of some of the more major cloud providers going green has had a tangible impact: while the volume of spam email has significantly increased over time, the amount of electricity spam email consumes annually has remained relatively consistent in the past few years.

“Curse Of The Celts” A Deep Dive Into Rosacea

The comedian W.C. Fields once said, “I never drink water; that’s the stuff that rusts pipes.” This was in response to a question about his alcohol habit. So what do alcohol and W.C. Fields have to do with this week’s topic of rosacea? Read on.

Rosacea is a common skin condition usually found on the face, which can be very disconcerting. It is a disease with various clinical presentations. These can include redness, flushing, coarse skin, and bumps and pustules resembling acne. It may also present with visible spider-like superficial blood vessels called telangiectasias.

The condition is found three times more often in women and usually presents between 30 and 60 years of age. It is also more common in fair-skinned people of European and Celtic origin, hence its nickname of “curse of the Celts.”

The diagnosis of rosacea is made on clinical grounds (i.e. signs and symptoms). There has to be a persistent rash on the central part of the face for at least three months to meet the diagnostic criteria. Classifying rosacea is important in determining the best treatment.

The exact cause of rosacea is not well understood, though there are numerous factors that likely play a role. The flushing associated with rosacea is thought to be due to the increased

number of blood vessels that are close to the skin surface as well as the increased sensitivity of the vessels to heat. Sun exposure may play a role based on the location of the rash though some studies refute this.

Skin inflammation is a major finding in rosacea. Demodex, a species of skin mite, may also play a role in the development of an inflammatory reaction though studies are somewhat conflicting. Free radicals in the skin produced by various biochemical reactions can also cause damage.

There are four subtypes of rosacea based on clinical findings, likely the result of how a particular patient responds to various biologic factors and triggers. The first is the erythematotelangiectatic type. Its main signs and symptoms are central facial flushing, often with burning or stinging. The redness usually is not found around the eyes. The involved skin can be rough with some scaling.

The second subtype is called papulopustular. This is the most common type, typically found in middle-aged women. It presents with redness of the central part of the face with small red bumps (papules) that have small pustules on top of them.

Phymatous is a third subtype. It presents with severe thickening and irregular contours of the skin of the nose, chin, forehead, ears and/or eyelids. W.C. Fields suffered from phymatous rosacea that caused his distinctive enlarged nose, known as a rhinophyma.

The last subtype of rosacea is ocular. It can

present with signs that may be present for years before the skin manifestations develop. Patients can develop inflammation of various structures of the eyelids and coverings of the insides of the lids. Symptoms can include burning eyes, dryness, light sensitivity or the sensation of a foreign body in the eye.

There are various triggers that can worsen flushing in rosacea. These include stress, alcohol, spicy foods, hot drinks, wind, topical skin products, caffeine, exercise, hot or cold weather and hot baths or showers.

The first goal of treatment is to identify a patient’s triggers so that he or she can avoid them (alas, W.C. Fields could not). Daily use of broad-spectrum sunscreen (protection from UV-A and UV-B) is recommended for all patients. Sufferers should avoid astringents, toners, menthols, waterproof cosmetics that require solvents for removal, camphor, and products containing sodium lauryl sulfate.

Some types of rosacea respond to topical medications including antibiotics and acne agents. Oral antibiotics may also be used. Mild cases can be masked with creams containing green pigments. Laser surgery aimed at reducing the size and number of blood vessels are the mainstay of treatment. Surgery, dermabrasion or laser treatments may also be used to reduce excessive skin.

It’s seven minutes after 10 p.m., and the usual ruckus ensues. My husband, Peter, is wearing earplugs. He is in the habit of doing this when we’re staying in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, because our little apartment is right in the center of town and, like all the homes in San Miguel, there is no air conditioning because it is cool this high in the mountains.

But the last few weeks have been warm, and it’s nice to have fresh air. So we open the sliding door to our little balcony, and we hear everything that happens on our street.

The occasional truck rattles down the cobblestones. The street is too narrow for large vehicles, so it’s only a few small trucks and folks getting home late from work.

We are surrounded by churches in all directions, and church bells ring early most mornings. Visitors are mystified, trying to understand when they ring and for how long. I suspect this is not, in fact, an exact science. Someone has to climb all the way to the top of the bell tower to ring the bells, and I guess anyone willing to take that job should be able to ring them as long as they like.

Firecrackers explode—sometimes in the evenings, but frequently in the mornings when the church bells ring. The fireworks have to do with the celebration of various saints and events on the religious calendar and so, while they are startling, I respect that they are part of the culture, part of living in the center of this very old city in the middle of Mexico.

But, usually, just before we go to sleep, the dogs across the street start barking like crazy, and even Peter’s earplugs do no good.

This is the thing that used to irritate me the most.

I would be almost asleep, and there would be this terrific yapping—loud and persistent and very high-pitched. I assumed it was random, and I was irritated that the owner didn’t do something about this nightly nuisance.

It was Peter who finally recognized the pattern.

At roughly the same time every night, we hear a motorcycle come down the narrow cobblestone road. We hear it stop, and as soon as it does, two little dogs start barking. We hear the sound of a metal garage door open, and the barking increases. Then we hear the motorcycle start up again and the garage door close behind. That’s when the barking reaches a fever pitch.

Peter says, “Daddy’s

home.”

I wondered if he was right, so I started listening. Sure enough, it happened at the same time every night. Occasionally, Daddy got home an hour early, but generally, it was just after 10 p.m.

Motorcycle stops. Barking starts. Motorcycle starts. Barking goes crazy.

And who can blame these two unseen dogs for losing their little minds once a night—the most exciting time of the day—when Daddy finally gets home?

Of course, we don’t know what happens. We don’t even know which house the little dogs live in. But I imagine Daddy makes dinner for them when he gets home. He probably tells them what good dogs they are. I can tell from their excitement it is a happy household with these two dogs and Daddy.

And so now, in addition to the church bells and the firecrackers and the occasional rattling truck, I listen for those two excited dogs. They no longer annoy me. I imagine their anticipation—the motor stopping, the motor starting and finally the long-awaited moment.

Daddy’s home!

Sublingual immunotherapy is an effective option for people who don't want the inconvenience or safety risk associated with allergy shots.

"More than 120 million people in the U.S. suffer from allergies and their related diseases, making it the most prevalent chronic illness facing our nation," said Dr. Ken Chahine, Ph.D., J.D., founding CEO of Nectar Life Sciences.
