Three Things You Should Know

1 Two lawsuits have been filed against school officials at Jay County Jr.-Sr. High School on behalf of a student identified who was required to expose her bra and chest during two searches for vaping materials. According to the ACLU of Indiana complaint, the male dean of students and school nurses, conducted two searches of a female student. During one of the searches, Dean Milleman touched the back of the student's bra clasp, and during another, the student was required to show her cleavage. This lawsuit comes 10 days after another student came forward with similar claims.

2 To help Indiana schools celebrate Earth Day 2024, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management is offering free hands-on classroom presentations to elementary students across the state. Every year, IDEM staff visit schools to talk about their careers and share STEM-based lessons on air, land, water, and recycling. Classroom Earth Day presentations are available for elementary schools and vary in length from 30 to 50 minutes. The interactive presentations offer activities such as reduce, reuse, recycle your trash, how long does your trash last or a demonstration on how water flows through a watershed. In-person classroom presentations are available on a first-come, first-served basis throughout the month of April, and each school may request up to four presentations. Registration is now open. Noblesville Lions Give Dictionaries to Hazel Dell Elementary

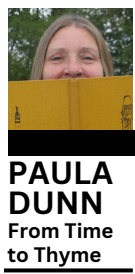

The area around that intersection may look like any other neighborhood today, but 137 years ago this week, it was full of people for whom it was the center of the universe. On January 22, 1887, the first commercial natural gas well in Hamilton County was sunk at that location, turning Noblesville and the rest of the county into major players in Indiana's Gas Boom.

The idea of searching for natural gas in this county didn't just pop up out of nowhere. It can be traced back to 1876, when a company looking for coal in the small Delaware County town of Eaton struck gas instead. What came out of the hole in Eaton smelled so foul, the general opinion was that they'd found a

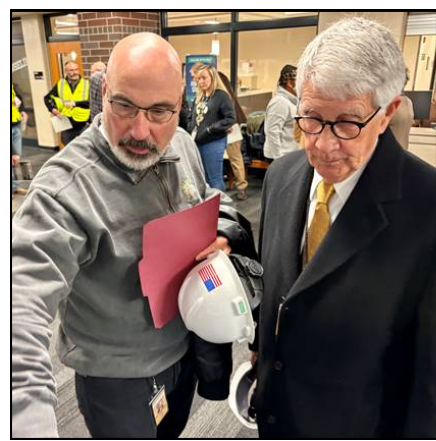

shortcut to Sheol (see last week's column!) so the shaft was capped and left alone. A decade later, after the discovery and development of natural gas in western Ohio, the Eaton folks began to realize there was money in that evil-smelling hole. They drilled the first commercial gas well in the state and other central Indiana communities soon followed their lead. The success cities such as Kokomo and Portland had in locating profitable quantities of gas prompted a group of Noblesville businessmen to organize a joint stock company to bore for gas here in October, 1886. Experienced contractors from the Lima, Ohio area were brought in to do the work. That December, Jessie Springer, the 11 year-old daughter of local contractor and lumberman G. E. Springer, was awarded the honor of driving a ceremonial stake into the ground to mark the

site chosen for the initial drilling. Three weeks later, on the night of Saturday, January 22, the contractors hit a flow of gas so strong, they decided to stop work and start up again on Monday morning. When they resumed drilling, they hit a gusher. It was clear then that Noblesville had the good fortune to be sitting on one of the strongest gas flows in the state. In fact, the city happened to be located on the western edge of the Trenton Gas Field, the largest deposit of natural gas known at that time. When the gas was lit on Tuesday, January 24, the resulting flambeau was visible as far away as Atlanta and Westfield. (The flame burned so brightly, country folk wondered if there was a major fire in town!) The city's newspapers were giddy with gas fever. "Boom! Boom!! Boom!!! Gas! Gas!! Gas!!!" was the Noblesville

Independent's headline, while the Republican Ledger boasted that the new well had "Enough Gas to Supply Eight Towns as Large as Noblesville." As more wells were drilled in the following months, thousands of people flocked to Noblesville to witness the spectacle of the flames and hear the roar of the escaping gas. Special excursion trains were even run from Indianapolis. One year later, there were 55 gas wells spread across the county. Twenty-six of those wells were in the Noblesville area. The January 7, 1888 Indianapolis News observed that the Noblesville Gas and Improvement Company was producing enough gas to supply 1,400 stores, two grist mills, the Hamilton County courthouse, the city schoolhouse and "several other minor establishments." Hamilton County's economic future looked extremely bright thanks

to its newly discovered inexhaustible source of cheap natural energy. Except . . . it turned out the gas wasn't inexhaustible. Such much was wasted on flambeau displays and general misuse that it was all but gone by the turn of the century.
