Hamilton Happenings

Conner Prairie Museum received \$5,000 to support development of The Resistance Cabin as part of the Promised Land as Proving Ground, a new permanent museum experience. That was part of a 2023 effort from Indiana Landmarks that saw more than \$470,000 go to help nonprofits and cities around Indiana save meaningful places. Drawing from a variety of funds, these grants support efforts ranging from architectural assessments and repairs at historic structures, to programs, workshops, videos, and digital walking tours promoting preservation and heritage.

Three Things You Should Know

1 The VA announced the availability of \$52.5 million in grants to community-based organizations that provide or coordinate suicide prevention services for Veterans and their families – including conducting Veteran mental health screenings, providing case management and peer support services, delivering emergency clinical services, reaching out to Veterans at risk of suicide, and more. These grants will be awarded through VA's Staff Sergeant Parker Gordon Fox Suicide Prevention Grant Program. The Notice of Funding Opportunity provides information about the program, eligibility, and award process. Applications are due by 11:59 pm E.T., April 26 and awards will be granted to eligible entities by Sept. 30, 2024. The funds will be used by the selected organizations in fiscal year 2025.

2 Historic Preservation and Archeology, a division of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, is helping a southern Indiana organization looking for new members to join its growing team. The Archaeological Research Institute in Lawrenceburg developed a program called ArchaeoCorps, funded by AmeriCorps, that offers several opportunities supporting ARI's mission. This opportunity is ideal for recent graduates or upper-level students who will be completing their degrees in archaeology, anthropology, history, or environmental studies. They are looking for like-minded individuals willing to serve and gain relevant archaeological experience.

3 For the past several years residents in Tampa Bay have been trying to find the source of low-pitched sounds. Many of them – including Dr. James Locascio, senior scientist at the Mote Marine Laboratory – believe it is the sound of fish mating, specifically ray-finned, black drum fish. Locascio would like to use underwater acoustic recorders to identify and confirm the sounds and a local resident is seeking to raise the \$2,500 it would cost.

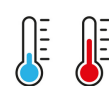

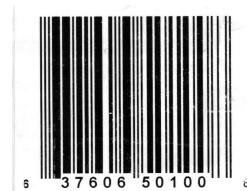

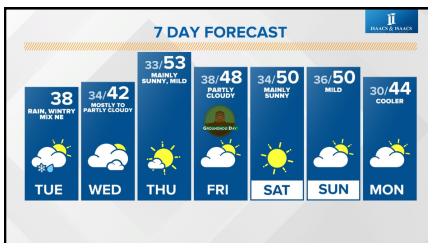

Four Charged in School Fraud Case

A federal grand jury has returned an indictment charging three individuals, including two from Carmel, for their alleged roles in a conspiracy to defraud the Indiana Department of Education through their operation of two online charter schools, Indiana Virtual School and Indiana Virtual Pathways Academy.

The four are, Tom Stoughton Sr. of Carmel, Percy Clark, 81, of Carmel, Phillip Holden, 62, of Middletown and Christopher King, 61, of Green Fork. Stoughton was charged with one count of conspiracy to commit wire fraud, 16 counts of wire fraud and 57 counts of money laundering; Clark was charged with one count of conspiracy to commit wire fraud, 16 counts of wire fraud and 11 counts of money laundering; Holden was charged with one count of conspiracy to commit wire fraud and 16 counts of wire fraud; and King entered a plea of guilty to conspiracy to commit wire fraud.

According to the indictment, between the summer of 2016 and 2018, the defendants allegedly submitted false numbers to IDOE representing the enrollment of over 4,500 students that they knew were not attending IVS or IVPA. Like other public and charter schools, IVS and IVPA received funding from the State of Indiana based upon the number of students a school claimed to be enrolled and attending the school. In general, the more students enrolled, the more funding IVS and IVPA received from the State of Indiana.

The indictment alleges the defendants manipulated this process to inflate enrollment numbers and ultimately receive more funding.

As a result of these false submissions, IDOE paid in excess of \$44,000,000 to IVS/IVPA.

The defendants allegedly caused students to be enrolled or remain enrolled in IVS/IVPA who should not have been, by directing employees to stop verifying student interest before they were enrolled or reenrolled, and by making incomplete student applications available so that the student information could be used to enroll students for the 2017 and September 2018 Count Days. Most of these "students" never actually attended either school.

Shortly before the September 2018 Count Day, the defendants allegedly directed their information technology contractor to compile a list of students who were not listed in the Indiana Department of Education database as attending another school and who had previously been unenrolled from IVS or IVPA due to inactivity. Upon receiving a list of approximately 600 such students, the defendants directed employees to reenroll many of these students and be counted on the September 2018 Count Day.

After IVPA was created in 2017, the defendants allegedly transferred hundreds of students who had not been attending any classes from IVS to IVPA to

continue to "count" and receive money for these students but also "protect" IVS from being held accountable by the IDOE for the students' non-performance.

In the spring of 2017, Holden and Clark allegedly fired an employee who sent an email to IDOE attempting to inform the department of fraud that was occurring at IVS. IVS and IVPA allegedly paid money received from the State of Indiana to fraudulent for-profit companies, many of which were controlled or operated by Stoughton. After the money was funneled through these for-profit companies, millions of dollars were paid out to Stoughton and members of his family, Clark, King, and others.

The Indiana State Board of Accounts performed an audit on IVS and IVPA in 2019. The SBOA referred the audit findings to the FBI, U.S. Department of Education Office of Inspector General, Indiana State Police, and Indiana Office of Inspector General, who investigated this case. A trial for the three defendants who have not pleaded guilty will be scheduled later. If convicted, each defendant faces between 10 and 20 years in federal prison per count.

U.S. Attorney Zachary A. Myers thanked Assistant U.S. Attorneys Bradley P. Shepard and Samantha Spiro, who are prosecuting this case. *An indictment is merely an allegation. All defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.*

to teams by their school colors.) The origins of the other high schools' nicknames aren't nearly as clear-cut as Noblesville's. I did, however, manage to come up with additional information and can offer theories in some cases. The earliest reference I've found to Carmel's teams being called the Greyhounds appears in a 1925 sports story. All the earlier articles I saw referred to them as either Carmel or "the Blue and Gold."

I ran across a couple of sources on the internet that stated that Carmel acquired the "Greyhounds" nickname because their basketball team had some exceptionally speedy players in the mid-1920s. That seems like a reasonable explanation, but I couldn't find any articles from the 1920s to verify that, so I'm not prepared to completely close the book on Carmel's nickname. Some time ago, Michael Kobrowski, the Westfield Washington Historical

Society's museum curator and communications officer, mentioned a theory that Westfield adopted "Shamrocks" as their nickname because they'd had an Irish coach at the time. Westfield did indeed have a coach with an Irish last name when the team's new nickname was announced in January, 1930. However, a quick trip through the U. S. census revealed that Coach Million's family had been Hoosiers for at least three generations, so I'm inclined to discount that explanation. Another theory is that the city's Quaker heritage influenced the school to choose a nonviolent nickname. That's certainly possible, but it doesn't explain why they settled on "Shamrocks." ince WHS had previously been referred to as "the Green and White," I'm wondering if the school colors played a role in Westfield's teams becoming the "Shamrocks"
