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Get Ready! Allisonville Closing Later This Week

The county has released a schedule of the 90-day closure of Allisonville Road. Remember, eastbound and westbound 146th Street won't be closed and neither will the intersection. Instead, lane restrictions will be utilized, and that will slow down traffic. So plan accordingly.

On those lane restriction, Allisonville Road between 146th Street and Kensington Drive (north of 146th Street), and between 146th Street and Helmsley Court (south of 146th Street) are the closure limits. The posted detour route will be 131st Street, SR-37, and Greenfield Avenue. On **Thursday and Friday**, the



contractor will be completing work in preparation throughout the project limits and along the detour route. At or after

midnight, barricades will be put in place along Allisonville Road to close the road for 90 days.

Be prepared for lane restrictions or short-duration lane closures along 146th Street, so that the removal of the overhead signal equipment and other work associated with the traffic switch may be completed. On **Friday into Saturday**, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m., 146th Street traffic should be prepared for lane restrictions or short-duration closures to complete any remaining signal equipment removal and other work associated with this traffic switch. Please use extreme caution and reduced speeds while driving through this construction zone.

Kindergarten Memories

Not long ago, Pam Ferber and I were reminiscing about our kindergarten days. We both attended Dorothy

Oliver's kindergarten at First Ward and, although Pam was a year ahead of me, we have some memories in common. One thing we both remember is Mrs. Oliver's big chart that held the names of everyone in our class. When you could tie your shoes, count to 100 and prove you could skip, you'd get a gold star next to your name. (I know we had to learn to skip because I remember having trouble getting the hang of it. My mother had to coach me!) Pam recalled taking some kind of test in a booklet where you did things like mark pictures that were different or draw lines to connect dots. (Apparently, I wasn't very impressed by the test because I don't remember it.) We both looked forward to our daily graham cracker and milk snack. The milk came in little (half pint?) glass bottles with a foil seal on top. It was quite an honor to be the one appointed to punch holes in the milk bottle seals for our straws. (paper, not plastic!) Kindergarten for us was half-day. Pam said she remembers the morning group and the afternoon group switching times after the first semester. I don't recall switching, but my memory could be faulty. Or, maybe my class didn't do it. In the 1960s, only the kids who lived in the country rode school buses. Students in town walked, or were driven to school. I walked to kindergarten by myself every day because nobody on my block was my age. The other kids all attended Conner, which didn't have a kindergarten that year. Back then, it was fairly safe for children to walk to school in Noblesville, even if they were alone. (I did, however, hear MANY lectures about not talking to strangers!)

Sarah Marone-Sowers has been singing since she was 8 years old. The Noblesville woman initially auditioned for Carmel Community Players' current musical, "Violet," because she likes working with director Kathleen Clarke Horrigan of Fishers and wanted to work with her again. "I then set about learning as much as I could about the show. Finding out the storyline, listening to the soundtrack, reading the short story, 'The Ugliest Pilgrim' by Doris Betts, which the musical is based on,"

Marone-Sowers said. "Once I knew Violet's story, I knew it was one that I wanted to tell." Marone-Sowers -- who has about 170 spoken lines in the 90-page "Violet" script and sings in 17 of the show's 30 songs -- is thrilled to be a part of the musical, which CCP is bringing to the stage for seven performances, opening Friday and continuing through March 10 at The Switch Theatre in Ji-Eun Lee Music Academy in Fishers. Tickets are still available at carmelplayers.org. While "Violet" runs as a one-act musical for a little less than two hours, Marone-Sowers' Violet character is on

stage for the entire time except for a small three-minute window. "This is the largest lead role that I have done, and many of my previous roles are more comedic in nature," she said. "I always try to find connections with the characters I portray, and Violet has opened up a lot of self reflection on my own life." 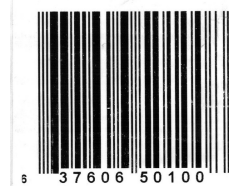

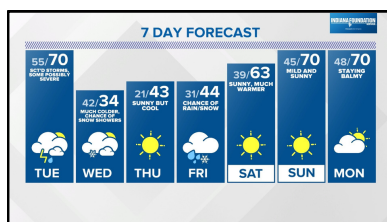

FIRE CUMULATIVE CAPITAL FUND

Notice is hereby given to the taxpayers of the City of Noblesville, Hamilton County, Indiana, that the City of Noblesville Common Council will consider at 16 S. 10th Street at 7:00 p.m. on March 12, 2024, the re-establishment of a maximum authorized property tax rate for the Fire Cumulative Capital Fund under the provisions of Indiana Code 36-8-14-4 for the purposes as follows:

The tax will be levied on all taxable real and personal property within the taxing district and will not exceed \$0.0333 per \$100 assessed valuation for taxes due and payable in the year 2025. Since this levy is included and constrained by the City's statutory maximum property tax levy limit, under IC 6-1.1-1.5-24, the tax rate set for this fund does not increase the City's total allowable property tax levy for taxes due and payable in the year 2025. Furthermore, the Common Council annually establishes a self-imposed maximum City property tax rate limit, currently set at \$1.10 per \$100 assessed valuation for taxes due and payable in 2024, and the tax rate for this fund is also included within and constrained by the self-imposed maximum City property tax rate limit to be set for taxes due and payable in 2025.

Taxpayers appearing at such hearing shall have the right to be heard thereon. The proposal for establishment of the Fire Cumulative Capital Fund maximum rate is subject to approval by the Department of Local Government Finance.

Within 30 days after the date of the adoption of the cumulative fund by the Common Council, the City of Noblesville will publish a Notice of Adoption. Upon publication of the Notice of Adoption, 10 or more taxpayers in the taxing district may file a petition with the County Auditor not later than noon 30 days after the publication of the Notice of Adoption setting forth their objections to the proposed fund.

It wasn’t until I was grown that I learned my mother had followed me on my first day of kindergarten to make sure I knew where I was going. I was so trusting, it never occurred to me to look over my shoulder. I have some clear, pleasant memories of that year, like coming to school in costume at Halloween, the baby chicks that hatched in our kindergarten room, and a trip to a working farm (my first field trip!) My most lasting memories, however, are of the building itself. First Ward opened in 1889, so you can imagine what it was like by 1960. It was OLD. (Good grief, my mother AND grandmother attended school in that building!) The kindergarten room was in the basement —

the dim, dingy basement. Right outside our door was a water fountain which Pam remembers better than I do. She described it as being long with several spigots. My main memory of that water fountain is that a couple of times boys caught salamanders under it. (A LOT of water must have splashed onto the cement floor from that fountain.)

Also in the basement were a storage room and the building’s restrooms. Even as a five year-old I thought those restrooms were pretty nasty and I avoided them, so I’m depending on Pam’s memory here. She described the walls as “puking” green or yellow-green and said the stalls had wooden doors with no locks. She added that the air freshener smelled

terrible, and so did the liquid soap in the soap dispensers.

At the end of our respective years, both Pam and I graduated in little yellow caps and gowns. The ceremonies were held in the sanctuary of the Methodist Church, which was just down the street.

The church, built in 1891, was almost as old as First Ward.

(I avoided the church’s restrooms, too.)

"The music is very challenging. It encompasses a number of different styles, from bluegrass, blues, gospel, jazz and some Tina Turner-esque rock," she said. "Violet" is a moving musical with a score by Tony-winning composer Jeanine Tesori ("Caroline, or Change," "Thoroughly Modern Millie," "Shrek the Musical" and "Fun Home") and book and lyrics by the acclaimed Brian Crawley ("A Little Princess"). "Violet" is the winner of

Drama Critics' Circle Award and Lucille Lortel Award for Best Musical when the show premiered Off-Broadway in 1997 and then on to a Tony-nominated Broadway debut in 2014 with a revised version. Marone-Sowers said, "The greatest challenge for (playing) Violet has been finding her within myself." She has had to allow vulnerability to come through to allow herself "to feel what she is feeling ... I've pulled on my own experiences to understand what she is feeling. My own personal losses, hopes and dreams." The Fishers native who graduated from Hamilton Southeastern High School in 2007, joined the Indianapolis Children's Choir as a youth. Her mom has a bachelor's degree in theater. "So, I've always been around the theater since a young age," said Marone-Sowers, who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Vocal Performance from Ball State University, has been performing in various theaters in the Indianapolis area since 2013. By day, she's a product compliance specialist. Before this show, Marone-Sowers was under Clark Horrigan's direction in Footlite Musical's "Anything Goes" in 2017, "Singin' in the Rain" in 2019, and "The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee" in 2022. Clark Horrigan said she chose the "Violet" musical to direct after following the career of Indianapolis actor Ben Davis, who had been in the Broadway

revival of "Violet." She and Davis had acted together in 1996 in Indianapolis Civic Theatre's "Into the Woods." In "Violet," costumes are period from the early 1960s, early in the Civil Rights Movement. The set was designed by a Ball State student "using blocks to set each place they visit along with projections to set the scene," the director said. "A lot of the musical takes place on a bus which would be hard to put on the stage." She most recently directed community theater in October 2022 CCP's one-act 90-minute "Tick, Tick, Boom!" an autobiographical musical by Jonathan Larson, the Pulitzer Prize- and Tony Award-winning composer of "Rent." Clarke Horrigan, a Logansport native, has been directing in community theater since 1991, primarily at Footlite Musicals in Indianapolis. She has won

seven Encore Awards in directing and acting. She is a member of the Indiana Thespian Educator Hall of Fame and has received Ball State University's Theatre Alumni Award and Theatre Distinguished Alumni Award. She retired at the end of last school year as a theater teacher at both Decatur Central and Lawrence Central high schools. She is currently an instructor at Ji-Eun Lee Music Academy in Fishers. Clark Horrigan said, "Working with this 'Violet' cast was amazing. Six of the cast play multiple roles and watching them quickly switch back and forth has been a joy."
