Three Things You Should Know

- According to our friends at the Statehouse, this may be the final week of this session for both the Indiana House and Indiana Senate in the legislature. Although lawmakers must adjourn statutorily by March 14, it appears the gavel may close the session this time on March 8. Stay tuned.
- Ivy Tech Community College and the Indiana Department of Correction are offering two programs for federal Pell Grants for prison education. If approved, people incarcerated in Indiana state prisons will have the opportunity to access need-based financial aid for high-quality education and training. For the first time in nearly 30 years, students enrolled in approved prison education programs are now eligible for federal Pell Grants under the FAFSA Simplification Act. Indiana is one of the first states to participate in the expansion of Pell Grants for incarcerated individuals.
- 15 regions representing all 92 counties recently submitted proposals for quality of life and quality of place funding through the expansion of the Indiana Regional Economic Acceleration and Development Initiative (READI 2.0). READI 2.0 is allocating a second round of \$500 million to accelerate community development investments statewide, and it will be invested alongside \$250 million in grant funding awarded by the Lilly Endowment Inc. This funding is expected to attract a minimum 4:1 match of local public and private funding, yielding at least \$3 billion invested to increase the vibrancy and prosperity of Hoosier communities.

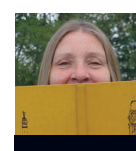

Breaking Hamilton County's Glass Ceiling

From Time to Thyme

Since March is Women's History Month, this week I'm setting our time machine for the 1980s, when Hamilton County's glass

ceiling took a big hit. (Don't step on any shattered glass as you leave the machine!) Actually, I need to start with the municipal elections of November 6, 1979.

Until then, female mayors had been extremely rare in Indiana. After that election, however, the number of women serving as mayors in this state jumped from two to eleven. Hamilton County had the distinction of being the only county to elect not one, but two of those women -- Jane Reiman of Carmel and Patricia "Pat" Logan of Noblesville.

Although Reiman and Logan came from different backgrounds, they shared a lot of common ground. Both were Republicans serving on the city council of their respective cities at the time of their election as mayor. Reiman held an at-large seat in Carmel, while Logan represented Noblesville's Fifth Ward. Reiman, a native of Toronto, Canada, graduated from the University of Toronto in 1953 with a degree in dental nursing. The following year she crossed the border to take a job at the University of Michigan's dental school. She married an insurance executive and the family moved to Carmel in the late 1960s.

Reiman was Carmel's second mayor and the first woman to hold that office. (Carmel's first mayor, Albert Pickett, was elected in 1975.)

During her tenure as mayor, Reiman oversaw a number of infrastructure improvements, initiated plans for the construction of new headquarters for the fire and police departments and for a new city hall, helped develop a zoning plan for U.S. 31, and persuaded Indianapolis officials to reconsider the commercial development of Keystone Avenue.

She was elected to two terms, but left office a month early in 1987 when she was appointed to lead the State Student Assistance Commission by Indiana Governor Robert Orr. Mayor-elect Dorothy "Dottie" Hancock acted as interim mayor for the rest of Reiman's term before taking office herself in 1988 as Carmel's second female mayor.

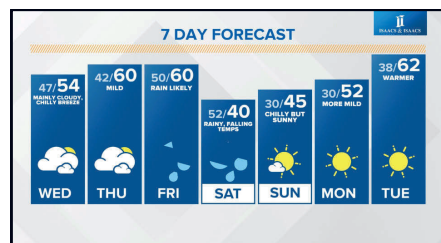

Pat Logan was the first woman to lead Noblesville in 129 years! (Noblesville's first mayor, David Moss, served from 1851-1852.) Born in Highland, Indiana, Logan attended Purdue University, where she met her husband, Jack. (Jack, who was with Wainwright Bank and Trust for 30 years, was also active in the Noblesville community.) The Logans moved to Noblesville in the late 1960s, around the time the Reimans moved to Carmel. A former director of the Noblesville Methodist Nursery School, Logan was working as a teacher's aide at Stony Creek Elementary when she was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Noblesville City Council in 1978. Her administration was marked by several infrastructure improvements, perhaps most notably the construction of a new Logan Street bridge. She also supervised the transformation of Noblesville's old Carnegie library into a new city hall and helped create Seminary Park. In 1982, she was named a Sagamore of the

Wabash by Governor Robert Orr for her work in the Indiana Association of Cities and Towns. Like Reiman, Logan left office in 1987 after serving two terms, and also like Reiman, she was followed by another two-term female mayor, Mary Sue Rowland. It took nearly 30 years for Hamilton County to see another woman elected mayor (Carmel's current mayor, Sue Finkam.) That just goes to show that even though the county's glass ceiling has been broken, it still isn't easy to be a woman in politics. Jane Reiman summed the situation up when she used to say, "I have to act like a woman, think like a man and work like a dog." Pat Logan passed away in 2011. On Sunday at 2:57 a.m., Noblesville Police officers got a report of a motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian at the intersection of SR 19 and Field Drive. When they got there, officers found a deceased adult male lying in the middle of the highway, just south of the Field Drive intersection. Based on his injuries and a large amount of glass in the area, it appears the subject was struck by a vehicle that fled the scene. Officers from the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office and Cicero Police Department assisted the NPD in searching the area for the suspect vehicle.

The identity of the deceased is being withheld at this time until next of kin notifications have been made. The Hamilton

County Coroner's Office is the proper authority for identity and cause of death determination. The NPD Crash Reconstruction Unit was summoned to the scene to investigate the crash and to collect evidence at the scene. North and southbound traffic on Cicero Road (SR 19) from Forest Park Drive to Field Drive was closed during the crash investigation and reopened in both directions at 7:12 a.m. The crash is still under investigation.
