"I fell in love with it because it reminded me of when I was in junior high school at Carmel and the basketball team won state -- pretty much against all odds -with a team that included the Shepherd brothers and their father as coach in 1970," the 1976 Carmel High School graduate said. "That Championship Season" opens Thursday and continues through April 14 at Basile Westfield Playhouse. Tickets are still available.

Winner of the Pulitzer Prize, the Tony Award, and the New York Drama Critics Circle Award as best play of the season, "That Championship Season" brings pathos, humor and

Raffel said.

It's her first time directing at the playhouse. The play has been on her bucket list to direct for years. "The coach is what keeps these guys together and meeting every year on the anniversary of the game. They are most comfortable and most vulnerable when they are together, which means there is humor and some tempers flare," Raffel said. "The coach is such a powerful force in their lives - even after 25 years. Coach is inspirational but flawed like most of us."

The play is produced by Jen Otterman of Noblesville and is an Artist's Choice Production: Shows that Celebrate Inclusion, Diversity and New Voices."

All three "well preserved" books originally belonged to Downing's grandfather.

The March 31, 1893 issue of the same newspaper observed that "constant reader" Michael "Mike" Buscher of Jackson Township possessed one of the most valuable libraries in the county. The stars of Buscher's collection were a 140 year-old Bible and a 190 year-old church history.

Perhaps the most impressive artifact in the gallery is a 350 year-old German Bible mentioned in the February 21, 1924 Noblesville Daily Ledger. At that time the Bible was the property of Dr. B. V. Chance of Windfall, but the doctor had inherited it from his grandfather, pioneer Noblesville merchant and farmer Isaac L. Davenport.

Moving along to our other displays . . .

Here we have a sundial owned by Washington Township's Daniel Haskett, one of this area's early settlers.

According to the May 26, 1893 Noblesville Democrat, the sundial had previously been located on the grounds of the Sutton's



Newby found it behind the chimney of an old log cabin said to have been built during the Civil War by an African

American preacher, Rev. Billy Allen. Rev. Allen later moved to Michigan. The Ledger speculated that he'd forgotten to take the gun with him when he left.

(I'm not sure that Rev. Allen's name is correct. I wasn't able to find any concrete information on a Rev. Billy or William Allen, but there definitely was a Rev. Charles Allen who later moved to Michigan. If anyone can confirm Rev. Allen's correct identity, please let me know.)

The last item on display is a baton that the very musical John Emmons of Noblesville used to direct local choirs. According to the January 7, 1887 Noblesville Independent, the baton was a family heirloom, carved out of wood from the "old ship

Constitution" by Emmons' uncle.

I'm not sure what to make of that claim. The Independent described the Constitution as "a war vessel on Lake Erie over fifty years ago." If they meant the USS Constitution, the ship nicknamed "Old Ironsides" during the War of 1812, it didn't sail on Lake Erie.

HOWEVER, some of the Constitution's sailors were transferred there and served on other ships during the Battle of Lake Erie. Maybe that's where the confusion lies.

(An interesting side note - Emmons' father, Lucius, started Noblesville's first newspaper, The Newspaper, in 1837. He was also responsible for starting the cholera epidemic of 1850 which killed many local

residents, including himself.)

The museum is closing now, but do come again. Our exhibits are always changing!
