Blatchley Nature Study Club Invites Community to Annual Wildflower Walks

You know that spring is officially here when it's time for Blatchley Nature Study Club's Spring Wildflower Walks.

I've been to the grounds a handful of times, especially in the springtime when there is much nature to enjoy.

The Clubhouse is located at 125 Boulder Drive, off of Edith Avenue, north of the historic Potter's Bridge off of Cumberland Road in Noblesville.

A hidden gem in our community, the 15-acre sanctuary offers nature trails that wind through the property with trails overlooking the White River as well as ravines along Fox Prairie Creek, which snakes through the grounds.

The sanctuary offers some of the most diverse collection of wildflowers and plants in Indiana.

Rick Towle, Noblesville Middle School science teacher and president of the Blatchley Nature Study Club in Noblesville, asked me again this year to share with the public and invite the community to guided tours to see some of the most diverse varieties of wildflowers in Indiana, from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on two Saturdays, April 13 and 27. (The first tour will showcase early bloomers, and the second tour late bloomers. So make plans to attend both if you love nature.)

Members will be on hand to guide visitors through the sanctuary and see one of the best displays of native Indiana wildflowers in the state, I'm told.

"From shooting stars to trillium, phlox to bluebells, trout lilies to wild geraniums, Blatchley Nature Study Club sanctuary boasts one of the best varietal displays of wildflowers in the state of Indiana. Come learn all about them with a guided

Welcome to the Timesheet. This column is a report of work done on behalf of the people of Hamilton County. It's to be informative too, a place to learn about projects and how our county government works. As your employee, it's important that you know what is being worked on as transparently as is possible in government. You hired me as your County Councilman, and my hope is that you will choose to be informed by regularly reading this column, getting involved, and by asking questions.

Council meetings are at 7:00 PM the first Wednesday of

every month at the judicial center in downtown Noblesville. Meetings are also available to watch online for those unable to attend in person. Here is where my time this past month has been spent.

Spring is in the air, the trees are budding, and potholes are being filled, let the road construction begin! Between Federal, State, County and City Road projects getting around Hamilton County for the next few months is going to be like me trying to lose weight, slow and frustrating.

March's work included investing time in County Finance reviews and research, The Regional Development Commission, the Hamilton County

Humane Society, Hamilton County Tourism, and deep dives into upcoming and proposed projects for both the full council as well as the RDC.

March's personnel committee meeting was cancelled. Normally, personnel requests are voted on as they occur, first, in the personnel committee and then at the next regular council meeting using a recommendation from the committee. The finance committee did not meet. We are scheduled for an update meeting in April. The challenge ahead will continue to be balancing the expense of upcoming projects while keeping our reserves strong.

Gold! . . . In Deming?

As I was working on last week's column about the "virtual museum," the part about an old gun being discovered at

Deming started to sound uncomfortably familiar, so I went back and checked past columns.

Sure enough, a couple of years ago another exhibit in the "museum" had featured an antique firearm found at Deming.

Thankfully, a bit of boning up on the difference between a pistol and a revolver soon convinced me that the two weapons in those columns were completely different.

Whew, I didn't duplicate myself! (But, what's up with all these old guns turning up in Deming?)

Anyway, in the process of doing that research, I ran across an article on Deming in the March 31, 1893 Noblesville Democrat that was so odd, I felt compelled to share it.

According to the newspaper, "an old resident of the place of which we speak" had recently informed the author of the article that there was gold to be found in the Deming area – "in paying quantities."

Gold! . . . in Deming?

The elderly gentleman disclosed that 25 to 30 years earlier (1863 to 1868) a group of Native Americans had camped on land near Deming, which in 1893 was known as the Stout farm.

(The Jackson Township map in the 1880 county history shows a Stout farm about a half mile northeast of Deming.)

The Native Americans (tribe unspecified) were said to have searched for a few days before uncovering a vessel filled with gold dust. They then used "crude instruments," to melt the gold dust into small bars that could be easily carried.

The reporter or the old gentleman (it's not clear which) stated that this tale

William “Randy” Horton

William Randolph “Randy” Horton, age 76, passed away peacefully at his home in Tipton, Indiana, surrounded by his loving family. Born January 19, 1948, in Tipton, he was the son of the late Gail Horton and Lois (Day) Horton.



Randy was a 1966 graduate of Tipton High School. At the age of 21, he enrolled in the Police Academy in Kokomo, Indiana. He was a member of the 3rd graduating class of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy, Class of 1970. During his 30-year career with the Tipton Police Department, he proudly and honorably served his community as a Patrolman, Sergeant, Captain, and was later promoted to Assistant Chief, before retiring on April 1, 2000. Retirement was not something that sat very well with Randy. So, without giving it a second thought, he returned to the job he loved so much, finishing out his career in law enforcement as a dispatcher with the department from 2001 until 2005. Randy was an active member of the Tipton F.O.P. and the Tipton Moose Lodge.

Randy truly loved life and lived his in a way that made him proud: having five kids, seven grandkids, one great-grandchild (with two more on the way), as well as serving his community as a police officer for 30 years. He would say that these were his greatest accomplishments. He could look quite intimidating if you didn't know him, but he was a gentle giant. Showing affection wasn't his way, but his kind and accepting nature was shown toward everyone that knew him. He was always up for a fun time and a good laugh, and absolutely loved getting together with family. After a big meal, you could usually find him fast asleep in the nearest recliner.

Randy was a good friend to many, and in return, had many faithful friends who loved him unconditionally. He always loved visiting them, and never turned down an opportunity to go out and have a little fun. Whether it was party, or a wedding, or really anywhere that had a dance floor or karaoke machine, you could always find him with a microphone in hand, picking out his next song... or running over to one of his daughters (or a friend), dragging them onto the dance floor to “cut a rug” and saying “just follow my lead.”

Randy also loved just relaxing at home. Believe it or not, catching up on his soap operas was a high priority. The Young and the Restless and The Bold and the Beautiful were a couple of his favorites; he faithfully watched when he could and recorded them to watch later when he couldn't.

When the kids were young, he loved taking them to amusement parks; he never grew tired of riding the roller coaster and other rides with them. Road trips and traveling were something Randy enjoyed very much, and he always wished he could do more. He always wanted to go to New York, as well as see more of the mountains.

Randy was funny without even knowing that he was. He was one of those people who was always making everyone laugh and usually leaving everyone he met with a good story to tell. He was loved by many people in this life and will continue to be loved and remembered by them for years to come.

Randy was a two-time cancer survivor. He always had a positive outlook and a strong will to live.

Randy is survived by his 4 daughters, Shelly Horton of Arcadia, Rebecca Horton-Hadley of Arcadia, Amy Horton-Beckey (Brad) of Noblesville, and Kacy Horton of Tipton; 1 son, Randy Horton (Shannon) of Cicero; 7 grandchildren, Brennen Horton, Chase Hadley, Chloe Hadley, Lilly Beckey, Asher Beckey, Kaylee Horton, and Eric Balcon; 1 great-grandchild, Alex Huber; and 2 great-grandchildren on the way.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Gail and Lois (Day) Horton; brother, Robert “Bob” Horton; 3 sisters, Janet (Dolan) Horton, Ruth Ann (Anderson) Horton, and Lu Ann Horton.

A Celebration of Randy's Life will be held at 1:00 pm on Saturday, April 13, 2024, at Heartland Church, 3611, State Road 19, Sharpsville, Indiana, with visitation from 11:00 am until the time of service.

The Regional Development Commission approved moving ahead with the new Police and Fire Training Center this month. We selected a vendor to provide an estimate of operational costs so proper budgeting can occur. My sense is that we will need to fund the first year's operating costs before each agency using the center is able to begin to contribute to the operational overhead from their 2025 budgets. Westfield is contributing the use of the facilities ground while all the remaining large police and fire departments in the county will contribute pro-rata from their individual department budgets to offset the operational costs of the facility. We are planning a top-of-the-line training center that will have few rivals in the Midwest. Expectations are high, with many of our public safety officials anxious to implement comprehensive training and interdepartmental cross training programs. The meeting room was full of public safety professionals in a show of support for the new facility. Based on preliminary estimates this will require a twenty-million-dollar investment to build. A request for quote participation has already been made public. Additionally, there could be public safety income tax dollars used to help with the investment and the remaining amount will be bonded. The bond will be paid with revenue from an RDC TIF district.

This month included a work session review of proposals from the Hamilton County Humane Society and Hamilton County Tourism. The Humane Society is in a tough position and location. As a no kill shelter located within minutes of Marion County, often animals are surrendered intentionally or dropped off at a nearby park. The volume of animals cared for continues to increase. With operations costs increasing we worked through an updated financial model to help. As the number of loose animals also increases the impact to the public increases. We arrived at a solution for the county and suggested that the same solution be implemented in the other public safety jurisdictions that bring animals to the shelter for care and housing.

Hamilton County Tourism proposed a new fiscal management process for the innkeeper's tax revenue. The council welcomed and reviewed the idea, then, after much discussion with tourism staff, decided to take the idea under advisement and consult

with our attorney and with the treasurer. In addition to the County Council public meetings, March's work included attending a Council work session, a Regional Development Commission meeting, a combined Cicero, and county officials meeting, watching a Board of Commissioners public meeting, attending a Noblesville City Council meeting, doing a patrol ride-along with the Sheriff, and attending a Cicero Town council meeting.

This month there were three constituents service requests. Usually, requests require research with a county department, securing the correct answer and then following up with the taxpayer. March's first question was regarding Economic Development in Hamilton County. Next, a proposal to build tiny homes on private ground for the homeless in our area. Lastly, were questions regarding the County's 2023 commitment of ARPA funds to assist Cicero's town council with the cost of updating their wastewater treatment plant.

A constituent expressed interest in any economic incentives that might be available to build senior, veteran, or affordable housing in Adams and Jackson Townships. The resolution was to connect them with the right folks in Hamilton County Planning, Hamilton County Economic development and with the Cicero Planning and Economic Development teams. The tiny house concept is not something new, however this constituent was concerned about government expectations and zoning considerations if tiny houses were allowed to be built on donated rural farm ground. After a thorough reading of his business plan, a quick check of zoning and how the process could work, satisfied the request. Lastly, I worked with the county attorney and three ARPA committee members to coordinate members of the Cicero town council to appear at the next public ARPA committee meeting to address any confusion with the request.

This month, it was an honor to represent you at the Interfaith Summit, at the DRIVE Indy servant Leadership speaking series, in a ride-along with Sheriff Quakenbush, and in meetings with Police Chief Mann of Noblesville and with Police Chief Gebhart of Fishers.

tour from one of the members,” said Towle, president of the club.

“...The things we have accomplished during my tenure as president continue to amaze me, and truly illustrate the dedication and energy needed to live up to the mission of our club,” he has said.

Emma St. Dennis of Noblesville is vice president of the Blatchley club and has shared over the years a wealth of information with me about the club and its history. Club members actually laid out the plans for the trees that are in Forest Park, she has said.

“The Wildflower Walk is one of our favorite events of the year,” St. Dennis said. “Especially after a cold winter (and spring), spending an afternoon in the woods is an incredible treat.” The event is free, open to the public, and great for all ages, kids, scout groups and adults, Towle added. Although the walking path is moderate, the path is not wheelchair accessible. The nature study club was founded on April 8, 1922, by Dr. Earl Brooks. The club, which is made up of individuals who share a love of nature, changed its name to The W.S. Blatchley Club to honor Indiana's greatest naturalist, Dr. Willis Stanley Blatchley (1859-1940). The Blatchley Nature Study Club was incorporated as a nonprofit on Nov. 12, 1941. Then Brooks deeded 15 acres of land to the club for use as a sanctuary and on which to build a clubhouse on March 8, 1963. The

Clubhouse (built with a generous monetary gift from Eli Lilly family) and the sanctuary was dedicated on July 18, 1965.

Each spring, the club leads Wildflower Walks, inviting the community to attend.

Each year, club members gather for a cleanup of the clubhouse and grounds. This year, they've been working on the trails, adding guard rails at four points. Members have also been removing invasive species, said member Darlene Patterson. Trees were trimmed and removed from several trails. The Clubhouse was dusted, mopped and cleaned.

In the event of lightning or downpours, the event will be canceled. Check the Blatchley Facebook page for updates.

Annually, the Biology Department of Indiana University awards a Blatchley Nature Study Scholarship to a deserving student. Since 1989, more than 33 scholarships have been given out. Monthly meetings offer special programs that teach club members about all aspects through presentations. Memberships range from \$5 for ages 18 and younger to a \$500 individual life membership.

was known to be true because several of the gold bars had been found later by a white man during the construction of his home.

to the Native Americans, a crock of gold dust valued at \$50,000 was supposed to be buried somewhere in the county, along with a turkey's foot and a tomahawk. (Why a turkey's foot and a

tomahawk? I have no idea.) The reporter noted that "Up to and including the 28th of March, 1893, the long sought treasure has not been discovered." That article caught my

eye because I'm always looking for interesting column ideas that feature the county's smaller communities. Reading through it again, however, a whole slew of questionable details

jumped out at me, not the least of which was the notion that a band of Native Americans would have been wandering through this area as late as the 1860s. By then, I had a pretty

strong hunch somebody's leg had been pulled. I just wasn't sure whose leg it was. Was it the reporter, or was it the old man?
