Three Things You Should Know

1 A winning Powerball ticket purchased in June is set to expire on Thursday, Dec. 26. Players should check to see if they have the winning ticket. The \$1 million Powerball ticket that matched all five white balls was purchased at Kendallville Finish Line for the June 29 drawing. The winning Powerball numbers for Saturday, June 29, are: 26-51-54-61-69 with the Powerball of 25. The ticket holder should ensure their ticket is in a secure place, consider meeting with a financial advisor and contact Hoosier Lottery customer service at (800) 955-6886 for specific claim instructions.

2 The Indiana Commission for Higher Education has a statewide completion goal for the 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The Commission's goal is to have at least 60 percent of high school seniors complete the current FAFSA by Indiana's deadline of April 15, 2025. The 2025-2026 FAFSA form is currently open. The FAFSA not only determines federal grant and scholarship eligibility but is used to award state financial aid, including the Frank O'Bannon Grant, Indiana's largest need-based financial aid award. It is also necessary for 21st Century Scholars to complete the FAFSA to receive their scholarship. Students can file the FAFSA online at studentaid.gov.

3 With the winter holiday season ushering in parties and festivities, law enforcement agencies from across the state will be on the lookout to make sure everyone stays safe on the road. During the traffic safety blitz, police will be on the lookout for impaired driving, aggressive driving and proper use of seat belts. 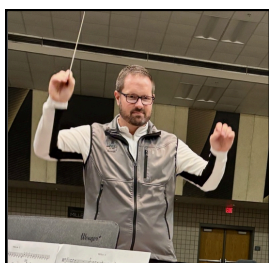

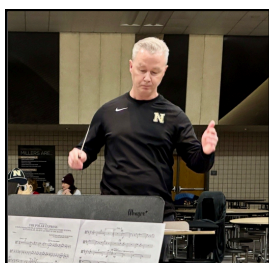
Star-Studded Guest Conductors Help Raise Money for NHS

Catching a (Radio) Wave



A couple of weeks ago when I wrote about Thanksgiving in 1924, I mentioned how excited Noblesville's

Masons were when their new radio managed to catch a broadcast of piano music from England.

That made me curious about the history of radios in Hamilton County. I was aware that people in the early 20th century used to gather around their radios like we do today around televisions, but I had no idea when radios became a commonplace item.

A little research disclosed that people were experimenting with wireless communication as far back as 1827, but the first patent for a radio apparatus was filed by Italian physicist Guglielmo Marconi in 1896.

The first U. S. commercial broadcasting station license was granted to Pittsburgh's Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Co. in October, 1920. The following month, the Westinghouse station, KDKA, aired this country's first scheduled radio broadcast —live returns of the 1920 presidential election.

Stories about local people tinkering with radios began to appear in the Noblesville Daily Ledger toward the end of 1921.

In November, Noblesville High School students David Findley and Albert Heinzman assembled a "wireless telephone and radio system" in the home of one of the boys and they invited their friends in to listen to a Chicago Opera Company program broadcast from Pittsburgh.

The following month, the news went out that Marion Harris, a well known blues and jazz singer, would be giving a concert from Keith's Theatre in Indianapolis via a wireless telephone. (Back then, the term "wireless telephone" meant a radio.)

L. A. "Doc" Priddy, the owner of Priddy & Heiny, "The only exclusive Electrical Store in the city," immediately set off for Indianapolis to try to get a "loud-speaking telephone" so he could broadcast the Harris concert at his store.

Nighttime 'Holiday in Lights' Brings Families Downtown

Noblesville's "Holiday in Lights" parade Saturday night through downtown brought out thousands of folks to celebrate the season.

The temperature was in the low 40s, although by the end of the 45-minute parade, wind gusts gave a chill to the bones. Thankfully, I bundled up in my long down coat, scarf and insulated hat. And although the weather was brisk, I could see that most were enjoying the parade. It's the second year that Noblesville Mayor Chris Jensen has tried something new for an age-old tradition. For as many years as I can remember living in Noblesville, the Noblesville Christmas Parade has taken place the Sunday afternoon following Thanksgiving.

In 2023, Jensen decided to move the parade to a nighttime event on the first Saturday in December and while the parade began at its usual staging location at Ivy Tech Hamilton County at 16th and Harrison Streets, the parade traveled Logan Street through downtown Square, crossed Logan

Street Bridge, by the Bridge of Flowers and turned on Indiana 19 by Federal Hill Commons into the Riverview Health overflow lots.

This year, a tweaked version of the traditional parade route returned, my guess, due to the more difficult logistics of parade entries returning to their vehicles in 2023 when the parade didn't end at the starting location, although folks in the parade could take a city-provided trolley back to the staging location. This year, the route traveled west on Logan Street, north on Ninth Street, east on Harrison Street, through Old Town

neighborhoods, returning to the staging location at Ivy Tech.

The changes to the traditional annual Christmas parade began in 2020, when the Noblesville Christmas Parade was canceled due to the pandemic but Santa Tours were offered with Santa and Mayor Jensen riding through neighborhoods. In 2021, the Santa Tours replaced the Christmas Parade.

The community asked for its parade to return. So the Noblesville Christmas

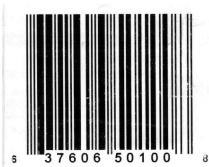

Parade returned in 2022, with nonprofits invited to participate, traveling the parade route through downtown.

In 2023, the parade took on a new look at night, as the "Holiday in Lights" parade. Both in 2023 and 2024, Hamilton County Emergency Management Agency provided portable light stands to better illuminate the streets along the route. Walkers and anyone in a parade entry without a motorized vehicle were required to wear reflective material or carry glow sticks or wear glow necklaces or bracelets.

This year's parade brought out more than 60 registered parade entries decorated with lights, featuring creatively decorated themed floats, sports teams, businesses, nonprofits, city vehicles and more.

While there was no mention ahead of time of whether candy would be allowed during this nighttime parade, there was lots of candy that was thrown from vehicles where we were standing at Ninth and Logan streets. In fact, my eyeglasses were hit by what I think was a Tootsie Roll. I guess being on the street for a parade is at your own risk.

There was increased safety in downtown Noblesville. The City put up new white plastic waist-high barricades to keep spectators from getting too close to the parade entries on both sides, from where I could see, Logan Street from 10th to Ninth streets and at the intersection of Ninth and Logan streets.

The City of Noblesville also put up yellow and black barricade tape to keep folks from being in the street and being too close to the parade entries in our spectator area, along Ninth Street just west of Logan Street. But the tape didn't seem to stop young spectators and their parents from creeping further and further into the street. But folks didn't back up until the Boys & Girls Club of Noblesville's big bus, decorated for the annual holiday "Stuff 'da Bus" fundraiser, was nearing the intersection of Ninth and Logan streets that two of the Club's parade walkers politely asked spectators to please "back up" to allow for the bus, driven by director of club operations Abigail Stutesman, to make a wide turn.

At first, I wasn't so sure about the decision to have a parade at night. I had questions, as others might have, about safety and the darkness. All of the parade entries were

traveling at a slow parade speed. This year, I was only a little nervous when the Corvette Club drove through downtown and one driver gunned an engine.

When you're a spectator at a parade, you need to keep your head on a swivel to stay alert and be ready to react quickly to dangers. On the very same Saturday night, 2,000 miles across the nation, in Palm Springs, Calif., a motorcycle crash at the 32nd annual Palm Springs Festival of Lights Parade injured 10 people, after a Palm Springs police officer lost control of his motorcycle while attempting a trick and the motorcycle continued moving into the spectators without him.

This year's Noblesville parade seemed to run smoothly, although we know there was a lot of work to prepare for the event, with City streets being blocked off, parade floats being decorated, wagons and vehicles being borrowed and hundreds of people volunteering for the parade entries.

Noblesville Adrienes Flowers & Gifts business owners Stephen and Moffett Craig were this year's grand marshals for the "Holiday in Lights" parade through downtown Noblesville, riding in Chevy from Hare Chevrolet. While it was nice that the Chevrolet dealership lended the vehicle, as noted on the signage on the side of the car, I missed any signage on the side of the car designating the vehicle was carrying our grand marshals. Mayor Chris Jensen drove a white Chevy Tahoe, which had a magnetic sign with his name on it and followed the grand marshals.

Several Noblesville city vehicles were creatively decked out in holiday lights for the parade.

One of the favorite parade entries and a shoutout goes to the Noblesville Fire Department which had a snow machine creating a magical effect for young spectators at the parade.

Noblesville Fire Department's Sparky mascot offered high-fives and fist-bumps to kids along the parade route.

Noblesville Police rescue vehicles and Hamilton County Emergency Management vehicles were decked out in colorful Christmas lights. (I saw one Emergency Management vehicle was driven by former fellow Noblesville Ledger staff writer Anne Auwaerter, a volunteer going on four years of service.)

Library had a fun parade float with a Christmas tree and dinosaur. Ace Hardware float featured an elf making popcorn at a popcorn machine on the float. Noblesville Parks & Recreation created a "Nightmare Before Christmas" float with a Christmas tree and characters.

Noblesville Street Department had a banner across the front of a city truck that read, "You've got a friend in STREET," featuring "Toy Story" movie characters, Buzz Lightyear, Woody, Jessie the Cowgirl and Mr. Potato Head riding on a giant "Radio Flyer" wagon.

American Heritage Girls Troop of Noblesville created a nativity scene. Noblesville West Middle School Band rode on the back of a farm wagon. The Grinch was a popular character at the parade with the character riding on the Poolwerx parade entry. There was a fun Peanuts float. A gingerbread house with lollipops parade entry was themed "Jesus Sweetest Name I Know" by Freedom Church.

Parade entries came from everywhere, as far away as Harris Landscape Services of Muncie, Ind., with a red wagon full of people, and as close as downtown with Noblesville Antiques on the Square. The Lake Meadows Assisted Living of Fishers created a "whimsical winter wonderland" with twinkling lights, decorations and holiday music, plus lots of elves. Dreiske Moving & Storage Co. in Westfield lit up a truck.

Noblesville Preservation Alliance always has a creative float. This year, NPA

displayed a gingerbread house, with "demolition" "stopped" signage, while Father Time and Mrs. Claus (Mike and Sandy Stewart) followed up on a trailer.

Noblesville High School had several sports teams, including Noblesville Golf, and NHS Tennis players who enjoyed their first time participating in the "Holiday in Lights" parade.

The event was broadcast live and folks can still watch the parade on demand at Hamilton County Television at <https://www.hctv1.com/>.

In tradition, Santa Claus was the last entry in the parade, this year arriving on a red Noblesville Street Department truck, and this year being portrayed by Noblesville's Geoff Davis.

With the darkness and all of the holiday lights, it wasn't easy capturing good photos of the parade as it is in daytime. However, I saw that photographer Matthew Doudt, who lives in Old Town, was there taking photos for the City of Noblesville. Many of his beautiful parade photos, along with his photos from other holiday events, are posted on the City of Noblesville Facebook page and Doudt's own Facebook page.

Some of the parade entries needed more visible signage so that spectators could see who or what organization was driving or walking by in the parade. Also, it was easier on the eyes to see the parade entries in the bright downtown area when the vehicles

When he failed in his quest, he returned to Noblesville and jury-rigged a small Victrola to broadcast the program. Priddy's home-made contraption did such a good job that people began crowding into his store each evening to listen to whatever stations his equipment would pick up.

Nineteen twenty-two was the year interest in radios really took off in this county. "Radio telephones," "radio stations" and "radio plants" (I believe those are all names for what we'd just call "radios" today) began to pop up everywhere.

Local businesses and organizations that joined Priddy & Heiny in owning radios included W. Hare & Sons and the Elks.

During the summer, the Citizens State Bank of Carmel and the Carmel Garage installed a public radio in Carmel to broadcast concerts and daily market reports.

A few weeks later, another public radio was installed in Noblesville at Stanford & Hayes (a funeral home!) That evening several hundred people gathered in front of the business to listen to an hour-long concert that was audible "for more than a square."

Private citizens

started buying radios, too. One of the largest privately owned radios in Noblesville was said to belong to Dr. Earl Brooks, the dentist who founded the Blatchley Nature Study Club.

Some local farmers were among the first county residents to buy their own radio. They benefited from the twice daily weather reports that began being sent from Indianapolis in March.

According to the Ledger, in 1924 hundreds of radios were in use in Hamilton County. One Noblesville resident, Calvin Wolff, was even broadcasting as station 9CZB.

By then, tuning in to American radio stations wasn't a big deal. The real challenge was trying to pick up overseas broadcasts. During the week of Thanksgiving, most large American stations agreed to go silent for an hour each night to clear the airwaves as a test to see if European stations could come through.

Although the Masons were the only ones to be successful with the test, radio was definitely here to stay in Hamilton County.
